

## SCHIPPERKE CLUB JUDGING CRITERIA 2012

**Those on the club list who judge at Championship show level or at club open shows and fail to submit a critique within 60 days to the dog press or the club newsletter may be deemed by the judges' subcommittee to be not eligible for club approval in the future. The club will take further action.**

**All Applicants:** Only **BREED class judging experience gained within the UK will count**, as per KC CC questionnaire for UK resident judges.

**A1 List:**

Those who have awarded CCs in the breed and are approved by the Club.

**A2 list:**

Those who meet the criteria as laid down by the breed club for awarding CCs, are approved by the KC as well, but have not yet judged the breed at CC level.

**A3 list:**

To have 7 years sustained experience of exhibiting, breeding, handling and judging Schipperkes	To have 7 years sustained interest in Schipperkes, or 5 years sustained interest if the applicant already awards CCs in another breed.
To have judged a minimum of 25 breed classes with at least <b>50 dogs</b> present and judged at either Open or Ch. Show level over a period of not less than 5 years and judged over an adequate geographical spread. To have judged the Schipperke Club Open show OR A BREED SUPPORTED OPEN SHOW ENTRY OF AT LEAST 8 CLASSES (Nordic show beginning 2009) or a minimum of 12 Schipperke classes at two different General Championship Shows without Challenge Certificates.	To have judged a minimum of 25 breed classes with at least <b>50 dogs</b> present and judged at either Open or Ch. Show level over a period of not less than 5 years and judged over an adequate geographical spread. To have judged the Schipperke Club Open show OR A BREED SUPPORTED OPEN SHOW ENTRY OF AT LEAST 8 CLASSES (Nordic show beginning 2009) or a minimum of 12 Schipperke classes at two different General Championship Shows without Challenge Certificates.
To have successfully passed an Advanced Judging Assessment run by the Schipperke Club. Candidates must provide a photocopy of "pass" certificate.	To have successfully passed an Advanced Judging Assessment run by the Schipperke Club. Candidates must provide a photocopy of "pass" certificate.
To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 Schipperkes when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).	To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs of any breed when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).

For applicants not already awarding Challenge Certificates:

- To have stewarded 12 times over 3 years.
- To have attended a seminar given by a KC Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examinations for:
  - 1) Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures; 2) Kennel Club Conformation and Movement; 3) Kennel Club Hands on Practical Assessment.

**APPLICANTS FOR THE B AND C LIST** who don't update their CVs at least every two years will be deemed to have no further interest in the breed and may not be considered for future placement.

Show level, and judged over a period of not less than <b>2 years</b> and over an adequate geographical spread. Show level, and judged over a period of not less than <b>2 years</b> and over an adequate geographical spread.
To have attended a Schipperke Club seminar; taken and passed the written test on the breed standard. Candidates must provide photocopies of certificate of attendance and test pass certificate. <b>Only seminars and assessments held in the UK by the Schipperke club or the KC JDP program will count.</b>	To have attended a Schipperke Club seminar; taken and passed the written test on the breed standard. Candidates must provide photocopies of certificate of attendance and test pass certificate. <b>Only seminars and assessments held in the UK by the Schipperke club or the KC JDP program will count.</b>

**C List:** The Club will support these people to judge up to 3 breed classes of Schipperkes at Open shows without any stipulation that they should already have judged a specified number of dogs.

Please note: Attainment of the relevant qualifications, or inclusion in previous years, does not entitle any candidate to automatic entry onto any Schipperke Club judging list.
