As a Club we endeavour to assist prospective judges to progress up the Judges Lists. We have liaised with the KC to undertake 'Special Awards' at our Championship Shows, It is hoped that they will attract a reasonable number of entries for the invited judge to include on his/her CV.

N.B. The Special Awards are judged as an entirely separate entity from the show proper. **IF YOUR DOG IS BEATEN IN THE SPECIAL AWARD CLASS IT IS NOT CLASSED AS A BEATEN DOG AND IS NOT DISQUALIFIED FROM CHALLENGING IN THE MAIN SHOW.** NOTE: To enter in the Special Awards your dog MUST be entered for the Club Championship Show.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members classes or competing for Members specials each partner must, at the time of entry, be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to & including the 7th day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 20/09/17. Wins in variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering variety classes, wins in both breed and variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a special prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options.

1. **WITHDRAWAL:** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 9(j) and 20.

2. TRANSFER:

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height & in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any other reason than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which it is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY

For dogs of 6 & not exceeding 9 calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

PUPPY

For dogs of 6 & not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR

For dogs of 6 & not exceeding 18 calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

SPECIAL YEARLING

For dogs of 6 & not exceeding 24 calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more first prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit & Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.

LIMIT

For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more first prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit & Open classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN

For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided & eligible for entry at the Show.

OPEN A.O.C.

Any colour other than black.

VETERAN

For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

GOOD CITIZEN

For dogs which have received their Kennel Club Good Citizen Bronze award Certificate or above.

BRACE

For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may, at their discretion, accept entries NFC. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

DEFINITION OF SPECIAL AWARDS

SPECIAL YEARLING: For dogs of 6 & not exceeding 24 calendar months on the first day of the show.

SPECIAL LIMIT

For dogs which have not become show champions under Kennel Club Registrations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more firsts in Limit & Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

SPECIAL OPEN:

For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided & eligible for entry at the show.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 8-45am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the Exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging: Special Awards 9.30am. Championship Show classes to follow.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close ½ hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting & benching areas is prohibited except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **ENTRY FEES:** Members £12-50 first class per dog. Veteran Under 10yrs £5. Veteran Over 10yrs FREE
Non Members £14-00 first class per dog. Veteran Under 10yrs £5-50p. Veteran Over 10yrs FREE
All subsequent entries with the same dog - £2-50 per class. Stakes Classes £3-50 each **ENTRY. PROFITS TO RESCUE**
Junior Handling Classes £2-50 (Richmond Qualifier). NFC £2-50, Special Awards £2-50 per special award. Brace class free.
7. **PRIZE MONEY:** Stakes Classes: 1st £10, 2nd £5, 3rd £3, 4th £2, 5th £1
Prize Money on offer for Special Awards by percentage of entry fees.
8. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under 6 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11 **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the B.P.I.S. is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of 6 and not exceeding 12 months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a Puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the R.B.I.S. is a Puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also be automatically Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of B.I.S. Best Puppy must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
- WITHDRAWAL FROM OTHER COMPETITION:** Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
- PROVISO:** For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- 12 **BEST IN SHOW:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which had competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex provided they are unbeaten winning dogs. R.B.I.S. must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
- WITHDRAWAL FROM OTHER COMPETITION:** Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
- PROVISO:** For the purposes of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
- 13 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition, after a period of 10 minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14 Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 15 It is not acceptable to handle a dog in such a manner that its feet do not touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should not that such practice could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the committee under Kennel Club Regulation F11.
- 16 All exhibitors must be familiar with K.C. regulation F (Annex B) - Regs. for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 17 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 18 **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS:** Your dog is vulnerable & at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidelines to help you through the do's and don'ts travelling to & whilst at KC licensed events. When travelling to a Show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the Show is on a busy route & leave earlier to avoid increased traffic jams. Your vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible & plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around your dog. When at the Show, never leave your dog in the vehicle. Take your own shade e.g. a large umbrella & always have plenty of water available so your dog stays well hydrated. Avoid taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended periods of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is likely to feel much hotter & dehydrated & this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dogs welfare. **WARNING:** If your dog is at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused. Anyone whose dog is entered at a KC Licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and not put the dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of KC Regs in this respect may be referred to the General Committee or disciplinary action under KC Rules 7 Regs. Exhibitors/competitors are reminded that Show Societies have the right under KC Regulations to refuse any entry.
19. Not For Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered
- 20 No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)


1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
(b) Any substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition but must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
4. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive
The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class, an objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS:

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk if left in high temperatures and even on hot days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

THE ATTENTION OF ALL EXHIBITORS IS DRAWN TO THE KENNEL CLUB REGULATION REGARDING FOULING WHICH READS

Any Owner or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.

On no account will entries be accepted without Fees

INSTRUCTIONS This form must be used by one person only (or partnership). Writing MUST BE IN INK OR INDELEBIL PENCIL. Use only one line for each dog. The name of the dog and all the details as recorded with the Kennel Club must be given on this entry form. If an error is made the dog may be disqualified by the Committee of the Kennel Club. All dogs must be REGISTERED at the Kennel Club in the name of the exhibitor. If the registration or transfer of ownership has not been confirmed it must be applied for before the closing date of entries. In case of dispute proof of postage of such applications may be required by the Kennel Club. Puppies under 6 months of age on the first day of the show cannot be entered for competition. REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
2. a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
3. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show.
(b) Any substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition but must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
(b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
(c) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class, an objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
