Last year, I pointed out that while much was happening on health in the wider world of dogs, the world of Schipperkes was relatively quiet. This is still very much the case this year and is due in large measure to the fact that the Schipperke is fundamentally a healthy, robust, unexaggerated breed.

During the last year, however, we have focused on two health conditions which have been found in Schips, epilepsy and MPSIIIB. The epilepsy study at the University of Helsinki is ongoing and the Club is keen to continue to offer its support. Mouth swabs and blood testing kits were distributed at the Club's Ch. show last October to assist the project. The more samples from UK dogs, the better. The University is still very keen to have as many samples as possible, particularly from any animals with a diagnosis of epilepsy, so please do contact me if you would like to help in this vital research. All approaches are treated in the strictest confidence. The Club web-site features an interim report on the study and will be updated when appropriate.

The site also contains information on MPSIIIB with links to the bonchien web-site in the US where many test results are posted and there is a pedigree data-base. So far, no affected dogs have been born in this country but some carriers have been identified after testing. A very accessible article by Dr Jeff Sampson, spells out clearly how breeders should proceed if using a carrier in their breeding programme and this can be found on the Club site. It is of the utmost importance that the guidelines set out in the article are followed to ensure that this devastating degenerative disease does not gain a foothold in the UK.

The new national Advisory Council on Dog Breeding has recently been established following the independent report of Professor Bateson and its eventual recommendations and comments will be of interest in the foreseeable future. Regular meetings of breed health co-ordinators will also now be arranged by the Kennel Club and I hope to attend at least some in future to help keep abreast of the many developments taking place in the canine health arena.

Health remains a major priority for those involved in the world of pedigree dogs and rightly so!

JD (1) AYLWARD & BURDET. CAROZZA LOUIS VUITTON.

10mth black of good size. Cobby outline. Super head with dark eyes and well placed ears. Level topline. Well coated with clear demarcation. High set, well furnished tail. Good feet, smart brisk movement. BP

SYD (1) PECK'S. BYQUY COUSCOUS 12mth gold with dark eyes and pigment. Short coupled and cobby in outline. A little high in hock, moves with brisk true action. Good feet. One to watch for the future.

LD (3)1. FELLOWS'. AVIDORE HISTORY MAKER AT BLACKSHUCK

Attractive head and expression. Would prefer a smaller ear but well set and used. Nicely shaped dark eyes. Well coated with clear pattern. Does not always cooperate when standing but active on move with brisk true stride. Holds his topline at all times.. Pleased to award him BOB

2. MANNERS. KOMARGO'S CRAZY DIAMOND Not the presence of 1. Foxy head and expression.. Not carrying full coat but texture and pattern OK. More mature than 3<sup>rd</sup>

3. MASSEY'S. SCIPSAR SUNNY JIM

OD. (2 1) TRICKLEBANK'S CH. NOCTE BORIS KARLOFF 10yo. Still smart on the move with beautiful head properties and true foxy expression, well coated, good feet. Tends to fall away over rump. Starting to show his age but still a super showman.

JB (2) 1. MANNERS SCIPSAR BLACK MAGIC Finely made b who needs to body, out of coat today. Pretty with dark eyes of good shape. Ears look a little tall but more coat would change the picture. Moved well. Needs time.

2. MASSEY'S. RISTINE DARK ROSIE Not as confident as 1 and longer cast but angulation and feet are good. More confidence would help show her good points.

SYB (1) TRICKLEBANK'S NOCTE ELVIRE My notes say 'extremely active' – Yes to the point where movement can be difficult to assess. Finely made but all the essentials are there – super head with dark eyes and well used ears. Correct angulation and good coat pattern. Considered her for BB but would not settle on the move in challenge. Needs time and hopefully she with maturity she will calm a little.

LB(2) 1.ROBJOHNS' QWONTOX QUINTESSENTIAL. Won this class on her movement, a b who is still maturing. I would prefer more coat but texture and pattern is good. Dark eyes of good shape alert and uses her ears well. Level topline which she holds well. Well muscled. Sound brisk movement.

2. MASSEY'S RISTINE BLACK ABBY Nicely made cobby b. with foxy head. Eyes dark, but a little round. Carrying too much weight which spoiled her movement.

OB (3 1) 1. ROBJOHNS QWONTOX CELTIC QUEST. Cobby, well balanced b. Well muscled with balanced angles giving brisk, accurate movement. Attractive head with foxy alert expression, ears a little wide but high set. Not the heaviest coat but texture and pattern are good. BOS 2. TRICKLEBANKS. CH. CAROZZA MAGDALENA FOR NOCTE. Finer made all through pretty feminine b. not in the best of coats. Pleasing head and expression but a little high stepping in movement. V. active with super attitude.

I was delighted to be asked to judge the Club Ch show for the second time and thank you all for what must nowadays be considered a good entry of 60 dogs.

I was pleased to find a number of dogs with typical, balanced heads and gratified to discover far fewer sloping toplines. Most tail-sets were better as a result. Virtually every dog sported a set of clean, white teeth. Well done!

I was concerned by several specific points. We have some big and some tall dogs again in both sexes. Both the judge of the well-supported Special Awards classes and myself commented later on the number of light eyes we encountered. And the perennial problem – movement. Universally it was pretty poor with front assemblies causing me disquiet. Sadly, I did not uncover any real depth of quality to-day with bitches fractionally better overall than the males. There still are opportunities to improve matters, however, since there were plenty of typical breed attributes scattered throughout to-day's energy

DOGS: Minor Puppy [2] 1. Muggleton's ARADET WIZARD OF OZ AMONGST MYWULF. 6 months old fawn pup who is solid and robust. I hope he has done all his growing early and will now concentrate on fining down. His head is strong but balanced with good ear carriage and a keen expression. His back is level, he has depth of chest and his tail was well-carried. Looks somewhat short on the leg just now and I will be interested to see what time does. Not altogether collected on the move but showy and alert. 2. Aylward, Burdett and Watson's CAROZZA VENI VIDI VICI. Not to-day I'm afraid! He drew my eye initially with his outline and good head qualities but he was not trying. He sagged, his tail, which is a little low-set, came down and he was restricted in front action. In a happier mood, I am sure he could pull himself together, show a bit more reach at front and look very different. The head is balanced, construction is fundamentally correct and he carries a decent coat. Will improve.

Puppy [1]. 1. A. WIZARD OF OZ.

Junior [2,1]. 1. Thorne's SCHIPDALE BOWLER. Largish black youngster who was also not thrilled to be on show. Flattened out, which accentuated his rather long-cast lines and low-set tail. On the move, he did not give of his best and went close behind. His head is very attractive and typical with good skull to muzzle proportions and he has correctly shaped, dark eyes and neat ears. Front construction was good and he has a reasonable spring of rib for his age. Excellent coat texture and emerging pattern.

Special Yearling [2,1]. 1. Reed-Peck's BYQUY COUSCOUS. 11 months cream dog from a larger mould. He has a typical, balanced head with refined muzzle and neat ears, ensuring a keen outlook. He is chunky, almost to the point of losing his outline but he has tight elbows, a decent spring of rib, straight back and a short, firm loin. His tail is carried well and he has reasonable angulation. Settled to move soundly. Best Puppy Dog.

Post-Graduate [3,2]. 1. Massey's SCIPSAR SUNNY JIM AT RISTINE. A cream dog, basically well-balanced and presenting a typical outline. His back is level, he has some depth of chest, a firm loin and reasonable angulation. His tail was well set and carried and he moved adequately. The head is attractive, if a little strong in muzzle and his pigmentation is exceptionally dark, to the point of smudging around his nose. Not in best bib and tucker but the coat texture was fairly harsh. 2. Muggleton's MYWULF FLAME OF ARNOR. A tall, rather rangy cream who was not in coat and who will probably look very different in 6 months time. His head is typical if a mite fine and he has neat ears and correctly-shaped eyes. Has yet to finish completely in body but he has a level back, some spring of rib and strong quarters. Not altogether settled on the move to-day.

Limit [7,3]. 1. Fellows' AVIDORE HISTORY MAKER AT BLACKSHUCK. A bigish lad but very balanced and typical with a good breed silhouette. He has sufficient depth of chest, decent spring of rib, a strong, arched neck set on well-laid shoulders, a level back and firm loin. He shows some bend of stifle and his feet are fairly tight. Carries his tail high and closely curled. In reasonable coat of good texture. Has a good male head with correct skull to muzzle proportions but I would prefer a darker eye. Moved steadily. A useful dog. 2. Bartlett's LUDWYN'S TOP HAT AND TAIL. Bigish lad who pulled himself together eventually to look much more of a piece. Reasonable head properties, with correct ears and a keen expression. He has a deep chest, straight back and some muscle in his quarters. Good set-on of tail. Steady and pretty precise on the move. 3. Donaldson's CAROZZA TOO HOT TO HANDLE. Compact, neat little dog who looks small to-day but who is probably hitting the top weight of 16 lbs. He is cobby and short-coupled with a good spring of rib, level back and rounded rump. Has a balanced head but did not look happy most of the time, which altered his expression. Has a very full, open coat but of good texture. Moved steadily although inclined to crab if not corrected.

Open [4,2]. 1. Mance's CH. SCHIPDALE ORLANDO. Brave of this exhibitor to come back a second time, since I did not do much for this dog 2½ years ago at Manchester, where I found him too solid all through. To-day, he is still chunky and robust and he must not carry another ounce or his basic outline will be lost but he presented the finished package of a mature Schip male. Has a quality but strong head-piece with neat ears and correct, dark eyes, strong neck, deep chest, good lay of shoulder, firm quarters and rounded rump. Overall, has refined a fair bit and his stamp of quality is evident. Forgave his slightly sloping top-line given his other qualities. Moved steadily and was in good coat of decent texture. C.C. and BIS. 2. Morley's AM. CH. CHATELET ARADET RIGBY. Classy, black dog of different type but of obvious quality. He is balanced, very short-coupled and cobby and with a short, straight back, strong loin and deep chest. He was in great condition and his coat, while a little inclined to be "all-over", still showed sufficient pattern and was of good texture. His front assembly is placed rather far forward but his action was good. Has an attractive, balanced head of good proportions but I would like his eye to be a mite darker. A lot to like and I was happy to call him back to challenge for RCC.

AOC Open [4,1]. 1. Aylward and Burdett's CH. CAROZZA MAN ON A MISSION. Beautiful cream dog with a lovely outline when he concentrated but he is just so big. He is clearly a dog of considerable quality with a lovely, refined head, balanced and obviously male. Has correct eyes, dark pigmentation and neat ears. His construction is excellent all through which showed in his correct, sound movement, the best I saw all day. Has a good coat pattern and the texture was reasonable. Drooped a bit in the challenge but I was still tempted. As I said last time I judged him, however, there is simply too much of him for me. Best Coloured. 2. Posnett's TARNHOWS SILVER SAND OF DREDA. Rich cream of 7 ½ and of such correct type. A real square outline with lighter quarters and a deep chest with well-sprung ribs. In middle-age, he is arguably a touch heavy all through now which rendered him a little wide in front action but he still retains overall balance with a short, level back, rounded rump and reasonable angles. Has a good head if a little deep in stop now and had a look of genuine breed quality. 3. Reed-Peck's BYQUY POLAR PRINCE. Attractive young boy whose head has broken a little now to give good balance between skull and muzzle. Overall, he is well put together, if a little short in upper arm but he is quite solid all through and can look short on leg. Moved a touch wide at the front but was basically sound. Suspect he could yet refine and finish looking very different.

Veteran [4,1]. 1. Whales' CH. ROSHAANA HYPERION. Mature 8 ½ year old black dog whom I favoured as a youngster but had subsequently "gone off" from the ringside. He is not small, at times he has looked rather heavy and solid all through and his topline can appear to slope significantly. To-day, he looked very good, still a bigish boy but with a shapely silhouette stemming from his good construction and lovely balanced head. Is always keen and alert and when his enthusiasm levelled off, he moved cleanly. A touch rusty in coat but overall in good condition. I gave his mother a ticket at Crufts 10 years ago and he has done her proud. RCC, RBIS and Best Veteran. 2. T. SILVER SAND AT D. 3. Muggleton's MYWULF FARAMIRS DREAM. Like a number of dogs at this time of year, not in his best clothes. A fraction long-cast but reasonably well put together with a typical, pleasing head and good eye. What coat he had was of good texture and a basic pattern was discernible. Moved steadily.

Junior Handling [2]. Both young women were calm, competent and confident handlers who presented their charges skilfully. 1. Michaella Donaldson who handled a puppy bitch which needed careful attention and quick responses which she received. Handler kept an eye on the dog and me at all times and moved at a sympathetic pace, never detracting attention from her exhibit. Best Junior Handler. Lose the long, dangling purse! 2. Leah Scales whose exhibit knew the job, so she had less chance to show her skills. She is a neat, unobtrusive handler who set her dog up carefully on the table and positioned him intelligently on the stack. Could have observed him a little more closely when moving but is another first rate handler.

BITCHES Minor Puppy [1]. 1. Whales' ROSHAANA JUNO. Rather fine, pale cream bitch of 8 months, a daughter of the BIS winner. "Pretty" was the word which kept coming in to my mind and it is particularly apt for her balanced, feminine head with pert expression. She is balanced in body, too, with a level back, some depth of chest and reasonable angles. A little bit narrow all through at this point, particularly at the front, where she was a mite tied-in at the elbows. She has lots of time, however. Still in a softish puppy coat but with acceptable demarcations.

Puppy [4,1]. 1. Donaldson's CAROZZA ATHENA. Transferred from Minor Puppy. Very appealing little black girl, typy and interested. At this stage, she appears a fraction oblong in silhouette and therefore does not need the lead right up behind her ears. On the move, she played up a bit and appeared a touch wide behind but I saw

enough to convince me that her action was fundamentally sound. Has a lovely, balanced head, good, dark eyes, neat ears which she uses, a full neck, dead level back and a rounded rump over a natural dock. Her angulation is good and she has the promise of a dense coat. Showed with attitude to take BPIS. 2. Manson's SCIPSAR BLACK MAGIC. Very attractively headed exhibit with good skull to muzzle ratio, correct eyes and a sharp expression. Another with a level back, strong loin, reasonable angles and already some depth of chest. Her tail is well-set and carried and she moved fairly steadily. 3. Whales' ROSHAANA JOCASTA. Another pretty bitch, very similar to her litter sister Juno but a fraction more robust. Overall, she is balanced, with all the essentials, although she was also a little restricted in front action. Has a good tail-set and showed steadily. Needs time.

**Junior** [6,3]. A class of bigger girls! 1. Hallmark's CAROZZA APHRODITE. Black litter sister to BPIS but from a bigger mould. Right out of coat, which made her look taller and she did not make the most of herself at times, emphasising her longer lines. When she pulled herself together, she looked more balanced and in a year or so, she will have filled her frame. Her head is lovely, however, very balanced and typical with the required blend of strength and refinement. She appeared a little narrow at the front and wasn't always steady on the move but she is still a raw baby of only 10 months. 2. Fegan's CAROZZA JUSTA MADAM. Born on exactly the same day as the winner but slightly stronger all through, especially in head. Still balanced and feminine, however, with a good eye and keen outlook. A tiny bit narrow at the front but with reasonable balance and good angulation. Her coat is of good texture for a pup and her tail was bang on top. Moved adequately. 3. Massey's RISTINE DARK ROSIE. 13 months bitch who needs lots more time, since she has just entered the teenage stage. Looks a bit long with a low set tail but I expect she will fill out and look better balanced in a few months. Her head is typical and feminine with well-carried ears and good eyes. Coat texture was very good.

**Special Yearling** [1] 1. Tricklebank's NOCTE ELVIRA. Transfer from Junior. Another at an in-between stage. Has a good head, if a tad strong and her expression is typical and alert. Her construction appears basically correct but she is a wilful madam and persisted in crabbing. Carries a gleaming black coat, not at its prime but of good texture. Another who needs more time.

**Post-Graduate** [2,1]. 1. Robjohns' QWONTOX QUINTESSENTIAL. Typical black bitch but rather tall. At first glance, she appears close-coated by to-day's standards but the essential pattern is discernible and the texture is good. Reasonably well put together with a level back, good tail-set and well-shaped feet. Would like a little more length of upper arm but her action was still acceptable. Has an attractive head with good balance but is a shade light in eye. An honest bitch.

**Limit** [6,2]. 1. Robjohns' QWONTOX CELTIC QUEST Sh. CM. Mature black bitch, mother to the previous winner. Completely balanced and typical with good head properties, dark eyes of correct shape and neat ears. Is the merest touch solid but is built on correct lines, ensuring a clean outline with a "pear-shape" when viewed from above. She moved steadily and carried a good textured coat showing the necessary demarcations. Showed firmly to take the RCC. 2. Forknall's AVIDORE HOT GOSSIP. An attractive bitch who did not always try but when she did, I saw a well-proportioned, young lady with many breed attributes. Level back, deep chest, shortish loin and strong thighs. Tail set is good and her coat is of a decent texture. Very good head, as expected from this kennel but her eye could be a mite darker for me. 3. Boles' KASSALMAK DAKSBABS. Finer headed black bitch, also a bit light in eye. Basically she is well-proportioned, if a bit light in condition and if she can settle, will look much more together on the move. Coat of a decent texture and her tail was set on and carried well, when she co-operated.

**Open** [6,2]. 1. Hart's CH. CAROZZA MOLLY MALONE WITH LUDWYN. A mature but rather frustrating black bitch. She does enough and no more, slacking off at every opportunity, so that she can appear long and low until she collects herself. She has a lovely head, with all the components in harmony and although her eyes could be a tiny bit darker, her expression is typical, especially if she deigns to use her ears. She is well constructed, with some spring of rib and a shorter loin than one might think at first sight. Kept a firm, level topline on the move, where she was steady and firm. In good bloom and when alerted, can show some sparkle. Her quality cannot be concealed, however, and she took the CC and BOS. 2. Whales' CH. QWONTOX QUIDNUNC BY ROSHAANA. Neat, compact black with a level back, deep chest and strong loin. Has a reasonable lay-back of shoulder and moved cleanly and precisely. Now, at 8, carrying quite a bit of body and her outline suffered. Overall, however, she is correctly proportioned and her action is still true and precise. Had the best head in this class, beautifully proportioned and with a lively expression although her eyes appeared just slightly full. Worthy title-holder.

## DOROTHY SEATON

Dorothy Seaton of the well-known Seacross Schipperkes died peacefully in hospital on January, 17<sup>th</sup>, a few weeks short of her 85<sup>th</sup> birthday. Dorothy and I became Club members at the same time and I soon became aware of her at shows, sometimes with her tall, bearded father in attendance and always with two or three consistently typy dogs in tow.

Although not an extensive exhibitor, she showed regularly over the years [sometimes also with the odd Cairn Terrier] and achieved considerable success in the ring. Her most famous dog was probably Ch. Seacross Rogue, made up in 1975 and one of only six Schips to top the Utility Group at a general Ch. show, a feat he accomplished under George Leatt at Birmingham after taking his third ticket. Through Rogue and his sons, the Seacross dogs made a significant contribution to the success of several prominent Schipperke kennels including Brian Elsworth's Brishinas, the Warrington's Pip lauries, Linda Wilson's Lyncathmors, Gladys Langton's Oldways, the Radash dogs of Rosy Archer and Mary Deats' Aradets. Arguably, Rogue's most illustrious offspring were his daughter, David Guy's big-winning Ch. Oldway Romance and his son, Mary Deats' all-conquering Ch. Aradet Cannonball Express, himself the sire of six champions.

Dorothy also bred Muriel and Tom Sadler's Ch. Seacross Sir William and Margaret and Jim Herron's Ch. Seacross Charisma at Marame. Other notable winners were Jamaican Ch. Seacross Yogi of Oldway, who sired two champions before heading for the sun and Int. Ch. Seacross Firecracker for Aradet who won several reserves behind Cannonball Express before emigrating to Sweden and an illustrious career there. Dorothy would doubtless have owned more title-holders herself had her domestic circumstances permitted her to travel more widely. Her ticket winners, S. Sir Henry (Rogue's sire) and S. D'Artagnan were strong contenders and her S. Baron was particularly unlucky not to gain the upper house, annexing two CCs and a large number of reserves, most to the invincible Ch. Pudi at the height of his powers.

Dorothy awarded tickets in the breed on a number of occasions including the Club show and Crufts, which she judged in 1993. One of her most memorable appointments was to judge "down under" in the 1990s, a trip she managed with the assistance of the Franhowil partnership. She had the holiday of a lifetime and was really smitten with the dingo!!

Always a loyal supporter of the Club, which she joined in 1970, Dorothy served in a number of capacities including Vice-President and then President for nine years until 2004. She also spoke at the very first breed seminar way back around 1987. She was very touched to receive a presentation and flowers from the members at a Club Show at Polesworth to acknowledge her 80<sup>th</sup> birthday, although a little less comfortable to think that she had reached the age when she was now regarded as "a doyenne".

A talented swimmer, Dorothy became a swimming instructor and coach and a life-time spent kneeling at the edge of swimming pools, produced the inevitable arthritic legacy which rendered her less mobile in recent years. This and other health issues made life much more difficult latterly but Dorothy was very appreciative of the care and support offered by Dave and Diane Forknall [Avidore] who have been immensely helpful. Dorothy Seaton has left her mark on the world of Schips and we shall all miss her very much.

# At Crufts Next Month

To work a 12 hours day, seven days a week, every week of the year calls for something very near to dedication. In the words of Miss Dorothy Seaton, of Seacroft Kennels, Wolvey, "It's a way of life, something I could never give up."

Her dedication is to her dogs. Lots of them. Everywhere. Schipperkes, Cairn Terriers, Bull Mastiffs, Poodles, Alsatians, and a chirpy little mongrel called Winkle. And it is in three of her dogs that Miss Seaton is putting her hopes for a win at Crufts Dog Show this year on 7th-8th February.

In the 20 years she has lived at Wolvey, she has had many successes in the dog show world and in the past five years her dogs have been placed in various classes at Crufts.

This year, however, she hopes that elusive Best of Breed will come her way, thanks to her combined efforts with Seacroft Fearless, Seacroft Rogue and Seacroft Sir Henry.

Fearless' looks certainly match his name yet despite his massive 10-stone body and fierce looking face he is an extremely gentle Bull Mastiff. Two years old, he has qualified for Crufts by gaining successes in several championship shows at Stoneleigh and Chester and has also won two firsts in the Bull Mastiff's league.

On a somewhat smaller scale are the two black Schipperkes: Sir Henry and his son, Rogue. Seacroft Rogue was placed first in the junior championships at Manchester and Stoneleigh and won the post-graduate section at the Birmingham City Show, while father can claim two seconds at Manchester and a first in the Schipperke championships.

creatures originally came from Belgium where they were used as guard dogs on canal boats. Their favorite of the boat when they could keep an eye on everything, this probably explains their alert, "toe" look and extreme self-confidence. The road to success is not easy and the Schipperke is no exception. A puppy is not usually a good dog until he is a few weeks old, says Miss Seaton. "But then you have to wait about six months to see if your attention was rightly on the beauty dogs aimed obedience classes, mainly to get them used to other dogs and people, or Lucid beauty shows too, also. We help the dogs to get the feel of things, to being examined by judges, all good preparation for the time when they enter the show ring. It is full-time work, with no days off. Miss Seaton's day begins early with the puppies to be fed and the various dogs to be put out one by one at a time can be done. Then the larger dogs are fed—their coat having to be brushed and groomed by Miss Seaton herself—and afterwards, with 35 dogs around, there is plenty of washing up. Grooming and clipping is also done. The dogs are then put in their crates and left in the hall for the night or taken to the show. To anyone who cares at all for the animals the rewards of such a life are clear to see in the com-

## Schipperkes with other breeds

In the last news letter the editor inquired how Schipps mixed with other breeds of dogs. As most of you know we do have other breeds as follows Cairn Terriers, Alsations(2), Bullmastiff(1), Groendaels(2).

Any young stock that we keep on in any breed we always bring into the house either at lunch or in the evening for a short while, to become accustomed to other noises and to meet the bigger dogs. The big dogs are good with the pups, and stand a lot of pulling about, hanging on to ears and toes being bitten and then suddenly a tired pup sleeping either on top of them or curled up between the big dogs' legs. The Alsations are very good with them, the Bullmastiff allows them to walk into her mouth and even pull her lips without any protest, the Groendaels will accept it with a more wary eye. The Champion will at times play with them, chasing everywhere and rolling with them, other times he says, "Go away, you are beneath my notice". The schip-bitches will also play with the pups. The little black devils get into more mischief than the Cairns. They are always full of energy, always find more to play with. As soon as they are old enough, depending on the weather mainly, they are popped into a run with some of the older dogs, to become used to them. As usual it does not take long for them to settle, having thrown something into the run for them to play with, as well as the dogs.

Then they are allowed to come up to the field with the other dogs. The first time, oh dear! The grass has a funny feeling or else it is wet to the feet, and then the world seems a big place for a little dog. After a couple of times though, they race up the field, attack somebody, when that body turns round to see who this little thing is, they run, then stand and stare ready to run still further or come back for more. Whilst they are learning to do this they are, of course, learning to use their voice, and doesn't a Schipp voice carry! Then of course they discover the donkey and after him they go - deaf to all other sounds, having finally come back they see the Nanny goat and her kid and off they go again (mind you, they have to learn to come back - or else-, but this of course takes time and patience).

Then again they see the cows when they are in the field, and off they go again leading the Cairns and again they come back - pronto-. Whenever there is a sudden sound or a different noise - there is always a surge towards it, as usual, with the Schipps leading and with, nine times out of ten, the Cairns following. Of course these little black dogs think that they are a cut above all the others, they must climb out of the runs that they are supposed to be in, while the boarders are being attended to, consequently they have much more freedom than the others - unfair.

If you stop to fondle a Cairn then all of a sudden there is a bundle of small black dogs rushing in saying that they are in much more need of attention and fuss than anyone else. If they try this with the big dogs, I mean the male big dogs, the big ones tell them where to go and the little black ones say "Oh yeah"!!

Overall they mix very well, all breeds together. Sometimes there may be an argument between two Schipps in particular and the two young Cairn stud dogs but this all as yet we have to have a fight either between the Schipp dogs or Schipps with Cairns. Whilst we are working we listen automatically to them and we hear a change in the note. They are told 'Be quiet', whilst we drop what we are doing and see what is brewing. The Schipps respect the Bullmastiff and give the Groendaels a fairly wide berth, except for one of the older ones.

I can therefore say, that with basic training, love, attention and voice control the Schipps and the others make a good normal happy family.
