Secretary's Report

The AGM last year saw the members voting on the new code of ethics for testing all stock for MPSIIIB before breeding which the Kennel Club has now passed so I would ask that all members now note this. It also saw the arrival on committee of Karen Bugg and David Matthews.

Last year we also saw the retirement of the Assistant Rescue Co-ordinator Judi Robjohns so this year I hope we will have a new Assistant Rescue Co-ordinator to work alongside our long standing Rescue Co-ordinator Lesley Thorne who does such a good job for the breed with this also sees the start of our new structure to the rescue when receiving and rehoming Schipperkes.

The club carried out a level 2 judges assessment in November which went well organised by Karen Bugg. A big thank you to all committee and members who give up their time so generously.

We now hear that from 2015 the Kennel Club are removing all single CC's so we look forward to having both sets of CC's at the four shows concerned as this can only help our breed.

Discover Dogs both at Crufts and Earls Court goes from strength to strength seeing our members giving up their time to support the Schipperke.

Membership appears the same as last year with some long standing members leaving us and others joining which keeps us in a healthy state.

In my half yearly report I explained how you could apply to be added to the Breeders Directory, this I have again added in the hope that you all read this. "You may or may not know that the Breeders Directory that is printed on the back inside cover of the newsletter and on our club website is charged at £10 per year and all the proceeds go to the Rescue Fund. If you wish to be included on this list you will need to send a letter to myself, the secretary requesting that the committee consider your application stating your Kennel Name, name, address and telephone, email with a cheque made payable to "Schipperke Club" for £10".

We did hope to have PayPal up and running in time for membership payments this year but this has not been the case. So keep an eye out you will be able to find under the shop tag of the club website www.schipperkeclub.co.uk.

The committee have now decided to add Puppy Parade (with KC permission) to our shows this is a parade of puppies 4 to 6 months old to get puppies used to being in the middle of our breed ring.

Treasurer's End of Year Report

We have seen an increase in our income over the past year thanks to two successful shows where the revenue was more than the previous year and our expenditure has remained much the same. There has been an increase in shop sales and we are considering ways of reducing our stock by discounting some of the items where there is a high stock level. We have seen a slight increase in the cost of newsletter printing and for postage and stationery, but the expenditure on this item does not exactly equate to the financial year. Venue deposits will also vary and it should be noted we have two committee meetings already pre-paid for the coming year due to cancellations. There will also always be a fluctuation in membership revenue which is dependent on whether or not the following year's subscription is paid before the 31st December. In the show accounts I have shown in brackets the previous year's figures for comparison. We very much appreciate the continued support and financial generosity of our membership.

Rescue Funds

Our income has decreased slightly but we have not had any expenditure for the 2012 financial year, although there are some costs which will be paid in the current financial year. ANNUAL HEALTH REPORT - 2012

The predominant message on Schipperke health continues to be a positive one. All the available information suggests that the breed is virtually free of health problems associated with basic conformation or exaggeration of any feature and is subject to relatively few hereditary diseases. That said, the Health Committee has continued to monitor several issues of relevance to the breed.

MPSIIB At the last AGM, it was agreed by a majority vote that testing of all breeding stock prior to mating, should be included as a requirement in the Club Code of Ethics. While there were some anxieties about errors in results obtained from the US lab offering the test, it was considered essential that we make full use of the only test currently available for this lethal degenerative condition. There have been no known cases of affected animals born in this country to date but some carriers have been identified. The Club is currently in the process of setting up an open register of MPSIIB test results on the health section of the web-site and further information on this service should be available shortly.

On our behalf, the Animal Health Trust is still in correspondence with the director of the US test facility in the hope that their data can be published for peer review in the recognised way.

EPILEPSY The Finnish study continues to make progress, although until recently, the number of samples (mouth swabs) from British dogs had been disappointingly low. Numbers have crept up now but more are needed, including from any dog diagnosed with epilepsy. (Information on the procedure is available from me). Final results of this longitudinal study are unlikely to be published for another 2-3 years but genetic markers covering all canine chromosomes have now been identified in 84 Schips with epilepsy and 71 healthy dogs (July 2012).

HEALTH MATTERS – RESCUE Concerns over how best to gather and collate an adequate, reliable health history on dogs coming in to the care of Schipperke Rescue, has led to a full review of our Rescue protocols and documentation. These should be ready for use by the summer.

WEB-SITES A number of web-sites on canine health now exist and most are reasonably balanced and accurate. The site run by Carol Fowler, however, had simply listed every condition which had ever been recorded in Schips, regardless of incidence. In addition, it was not clear which diseases had a known hereditary component. Following amicable discussions with Mrs Fowler last year, the Health Committee was successful in having 5 conditions removed from the site, leaving a much more accurate health profile of the breed.

BREED HEALTH SURVEY Initial planning has begun on a second, short survey on breed health, hopefully to be available in both paper form and on-line. The response to our first survey was not particularly high and the Health Committee would still like some hard and fast facts on breed health to inform future work.

GENETIC DIVERSITY This is a significant topic which is likely to have increasing relevance for all pedigree dog breeders in the near future. The Kennel Club Genetics Centre at the Animal Health Trust has conducted population analyses on most breeds in the UK, including Schipperkes. A full article on the subject by Dr Jeff Sampson will appear in the Spring edition.

Briefly, the rate of in-breeding (the mating of close relatives) in this breed over the last 30 years is estimated at 1.20% per generation. In essence, this translates as no more than 43 animals being used for breeding at any given time. To maintain a viable, healthy population, the recommended minimum effective population size is 100, which gives a safer in-breeding rate of 0.50% per generation. There is, therefore, a real danger of breeding ourselves in to a corner where breed health could be seriously compromised and “new” diseases begin to emerge. The Health Committee will give consideration very soon to the strategies which the Club might implement to help members tackle this worrying situation.

Rescue Annual Report

The following dogs have been helped this year:-

Sally

Sally was handed into Coventry RSPCA last year by her owner because she was moving and couldn't take her. I have found that this happens frequently when older people are moving to sheltered housing as pets are not often allowed.

Sally was frightened and aggressive with people. She would not tolerate having her lead put on and being handled. She had to be muzzled when taken to the vets. After 10 days the staff daily diary documented that no progress was being made and it appeared she would have to be euthanased. They contacted me and I went to collect her.

I ignored her snapping and snarling and got her in the car. At the kennels she seemed to be alright with the other dogs but could not be approached by people.

I noticed she had a tight collar and there was a very large lump on the right side of her neck, reported to be a fatty lump by the PDSA vet in Coventry.

Thankfully Tracy Holmes and my kennel landlady, Dot, managed to get hold of her and remove the collar. We all thought this was uncomfortable for her and we were right because as soon as it was removed there was an immediate change in her temperament. She allowed stroking and grooming.

Progress was good over the next few months and she played with the other dogs, went for walks and enjoyed attention from many people.

Eventually Joan and her husband showed some interest in taking her and she has now settled very well with them. They had the lump removed at considerable expense as which turned out to be benign.

She enjoys walks and weekends away in their caravan at the beach. Her quality of life has improved greatly as I understand from the previous owner she was only walked at night and never met people. All she knew was a house, cat and the woman who had had her since she was a puppy.

Shadow

Shadow was advertised as a 10 month old puppy for sale on Gumtree. The family who brought him travelled from the south coast to Liverpool to get him. They had no idea about the characteristics of a Schipperke but wanted him for his looks. They had 2 small children under 4 years and no experience with dogs.

Following a couple of weeks settling in they discovered traits such as nipping and guarding. He didn't tolerate other dogs in the street and attacked a neighbour.

They employed an animal behaviourist but progress was difficult. I suspected that the family were not always following the behaviourists instructions and eventually she suggested strongly that he was rehomed for the safety of the children.

They contacted me and I gave them my view agreeing with the advice given. However, they didn't want to rehome him. I heard nothing more about him until someone contacted me from another breed giving me details of where he was. The family had taken him to the Furry Friends Rescue in Surrey and he was featured on their web site.

I contacted Emma who runs this small home-based rescue and it appeared he had settled in and was attached to one of her other dogs.

I offered to take him but we both agreed it wouldn't be in his best interest to move as we believed he had had at least 4 homes and 2 name changes in his short life.

Emma has now found him a home in Kent and is on hand to help with any problems should they arise. The new owners are experienced with larger breeds and to date everything seems to have settled.

Guiness

Guiness is a 13 year old dog found wandering the Oldham area. The dog warden took him to the pound in Preston to wait 7 days before euthanasia. He was noticed by a woman who runs the Worth west Small Dog Rescue. She also does the Papillion Rescue.

She arranged for him to be fostered as she doesn't have kennels and he has become very settled there. It would appear that the foster carer is keen to keep him.

This dog was microchipped but the phone number on his records were not up to date so the owner could not be contacted. His name and age were obtained from the records.

Microchipping is essential in case a dog goes missing but as shown here, needs to be kept up to date.

Masie

As most of you know I have had Masie in Rescue now for sometime. In fact its 4 years, she came as a 13 year old and is now a ripe old age of 17 years. She manages very well considering a little arthritis in her back legs and barking to tell me to hurry up with her food.

Foster

Foster came to me about 2 years ago from a violent situation in the family home. He had a mouthful of rotten teeth and had a fit. Once I had his teeth sorted out he was a happy chap although he didn't like attention. Grooming was a challenge but you can't inflict serious injury with few teeth.

He spent a couple of years enjoying other dogs company but sadly lost the use of his back legs on 25/1/13 and became incontinent. I had to have him put to sleep. I can't imagine how his life had been prior to me getting him but I know we were able to make his last 2 years enjoyable.

Over the years it has always been the case that I have 2 old dogs that stay with me to the end. I am sure there is another one out there ready to take Foster's place.

I would like to pay a tribute to Margaret Short who passed away at Christmas. Margaret was very supporting of Rescue when they had Schipperkes. She & Roy Baker were instrumental some years ago in bringing about changes to the Club Rules to formalise and make Rescue more accountable to the Club. This work has continued with the efforts of Ian Millar and ensures we are in line with Kennel Club requirements.

Finally I would like to thank all those who offered help while I have been having my second hip replacement. It is much appreciated. I would particularly like to thank Terry, my husband, for taking the reins again and Tracy Holmes for being there and helping when needed with all my dogs.

You all may have noticed that the assistant co-ordinator post is vacant, if you are thinking about it all I can say is that I find it very rewarding as we have done some great things over the years, so come and join me.

I consider it an honour to have been invited to judge the Special Awards Classes at the recent Schipperke Club Championship Show. My thanks to everyone for such a very nice day.

I was surprised to find a number of bites which deviated from the norm - and the standard. Feet were somewhat "variable" but pasterns were generally strong. I found just one or two exhibits a little hollow in front and short in brisket but generally ribbing was ideal. As with my own breed, I have no colour preference - it's what's underneath that counts!

I have watched the breed, and have judged some classes of Schipperke, and the weight clause in the standard has not given me any worries - however I was a little pre-concerned that on this occasion (doing it properly, one might say) I might get "hung up" on size; fortunately in the excitement of getting my hands on some lovely dogs - I forgot to worry about it!

Special Yearling (8)

1. Philpott's 6 month old dog - ARADET EXPERT TIMING. A very confident young man with pleasing head qualities, particularly liked his eyes. Strong neck leading into nicely angulated shoulders. Some "fill" to front and ribs nicely sprung and deep. Creditable feet. Balanced all the way through and moved freely.
2. Manners' dog, ROOPEC DIAMOND BLACK. Handsome head with nice expression but I just preferred the overall body properties of the class winner. Nice feet. Angulation balanced fore and aft and moved soundly.
3. Peacock's bitch, ARADET XPRESS DELIVERY TO ROSARAMARK. Lovely head - very feminine. Admirable ribbing and balanced in angulation. Moved freely.

Special Limit (7)

1. Robjohns' dog QWONTOX QUINCY. Liked his head properties. Arched, strong, neck leading down into decent shoulder angulation which is balanced through with hindquarters. Feet pleased me. So did his movement.
2. Manners' bitch, SCIPSAR BLACK MAGIC AT ROOPEC. A smaller type. Sound in head properties and very feminine. Nicely angulated and balanced overall - though a somewhat loose tail spoilt the overall picture. Feet nice and movement favourable.
3. Hardy's dog BYQUY SEBASTIAN AT PALMOSA. A larger type. Strong neck and nice feet. Pleasing ribbing Somewhat apprehensive on the table but moved and showed well once back on the floor - though did not have quite the overall balance I was looking for.

RADASH SCHIPPERKES

It was so nice to open the Newsletter this morning, to see the advertisement for Amaska Schipperke puppies.

Sheila Greaves, who had them, was a good friend of mine. When she started to find it difficult to get to Championship shows, she sold Boris to me.

He settled well and soon-ish, and, became my second champion. The first was my Ch Radash Amigo, who beat Boris into second place by only two or three months. By today's standards Boris was rather plain, well bodied and cut with a short coat. The coat was harsh with good ruff and culottes. He was an excellent stud dog and he would mate with anything, willing or not!

One of his sons, Radash Admiral Benlow went to the Franhowil Kennels, where, he sired Ch Franhowil Gold Dust and several others that are behind dogs being shown today. Boris's last litter sired when he was over twelve years of age which, was a litter of five puppies. One of the puppies went back to Mrs Greaves as a companion. Boris died in 1993 at the age of fifteen and three quarters. I had just returned from a good day at crufts winning open dog and open bitch with litter brother and sister. (Tickets went to veterans). When I arrived home I let Boris out into the garden, he took five steps into the yard and dropped dead! Lovely for him but a bit of a shock for me!

Now, why Schipperkes? Well, going back in history, my big sister bought me a book for my tenth birthday. It was second hand from a lending library which was closing and cost the princely sum of three shillings and sixpence! It was "Your first Dog" by Lady Kitty Ritson. There was a photo of a Schipperke (rather like Boris) which was standing with front feet on a book and gazing at something. I was instantly hooked! However it was nearly thirty years and five children later before I saw one in the flesh. It was at our local Agricultural Show, there were two entered, one was Ch Runninghill Peter Whimsey. The other was his litter brother. Too shy to approach Mrs Sykes, I went home, did a lot of thinking, then obtained a list of breeders (about two) from the Kennel Club.

After about nine months of getting no results, I wrote to Mrs Sykes, she had nothing but put me in touch with Mr Coates who lived in Malton. I met him at Blackpool Champion Show in 1973. He "vetted" me then showed me how puppies should be docked! He said he would let me have a two year old bitch but I would have to wait until she'd had her season. Six weeks later we met on Skipton car park. Schip Kirkdale Myrabelle came out of her box and jumped into my husband's arms! Wise animal as he had not fancied one of those black so and so things until she converted him. Myra was a combination of Hallbower and Mottram breeding and was an excellent foundation bitch.

Rosy goes on to say that she hopes to do a little showing next year (health permitting) and that she might see me sometime.

I must say it will be nice for me to put a face to the lady who wrote me such a lovely letter, and, hope that she has brought some memories back to some of you Schipperke lovers.

Thanks to Rosy for spending the time to write this most interesting article for the Newsletter.

Genetic Diversity

Recently, there has been a growing interest in the rate at which genetic diversity is being lost in the two hundred plus breeds currently recognised by the KC and the population geneticists at the KC Genetics Centre at the Animal Health Trust are working through all of these breeds to provide an evaluation of the current state of their population structure. I think it is fair to say that there is still a great deal of misunderstanding as to the relevance of this information. However, to my mind, the situation is really quite simple, as the rate of loss of genetic diversity continues to increase within a breed, then the risk of this having a serious impact on the breed also increases, an impact that could seriously challenge the continued existence of a breed. Being able to manage the rate of loss of diversity will also allow breeders to manage the attendant risks. The problem is that the ways that breeders can manage this loss of diversity will run in the face of traditional breeding practices and progress will not be made until most breeders accept that there really is a need to control the loss of diversity, something that will require a fair amount of education and persuasion.

The KC Genetics Centre has produced a population analysis for the Schipperke and its conclusion is as follows:

"The analysis was based on the complete computerised pedigree records for the current UK Kennel Club registered Schipperke population. The rate of inbreeding over the past 30 years (1980-2009) was estimated at 1.20% per generation. This leads to an estimate of an effective population size of 42.3 for the UK Schipperke population. This is considerably below the recommended minimum effective population size of 100 (maximum inbreeding rate of 0.50% per generation). Comparison of the observed and expected rates of inbreeding show that the observed rate of inbreeding is higher than expected over the last 30 years and this suggests that the mating of close relatives and line-breeding is being practised in this breed. Since the breed effective population size is well below the minimum recommended, it is advised that UK Schipperke breeders should seek strategies to conserve genetic diversity given the small census size of this breed in the UK.

There is, additionally, evidence for modest popular sire effects. While the majority of sires have 2 or fewer registered offspring, there are 3 sires with 50 or more offspring apiece. The largest number of offspring by a single sire is 78. Some dams are also more prolific than others, 3 dams are recorded as having 20 or more offspring. The maximum number of offspring for a dam is 27.

Some adjustments to the breeding strategy would assist the breed in aiming for an effective population size approaching the threshold required to reach a sustainable rate of inbreeding (no more than 0.50% per generation).

Some recommendations to this end are outlined below:

1. Minimise the relatedness of individual sire and dams used
2. Limit numbers of offspring contributed by individual sires and dams
3. Make use of overseas bloodlines"

Given this assessment, it seems to me unwise to remove any dog unnecessarily from the breed's breeding pool, which really gets me to the main point of this article, which is "To breed or not to breed from MPS III carriers?"

Most of the UK scientific community involved in DNA testing for recessively inherited conditions in the dog offer the same advice on using DNA testing as part of a controlled breeding programme. The guidelines were developed in 2000 when the first such DNA test (that for CLAD in Irish Setters) became available to UK dog breeders, and the advice has remained pretty constant since that time for all other DNA tests that have been developed. The primary imperative is to make sure that all dogs are DNA tested before breeding so that the breeders know their genotype, their genetic make-up with respect to MPS III. Armed with this information, breeders can construct a breeding programme to reduce the frequency of the mutant gene in the breed without the need to remove any dog from the breeding pool simply because it carries a copy of the mutant gene. Central to this is the fact that carriers of MPS III can be bred from. However, carriers should only be bred to a DNA –tested normal dog, one that is clear of the MPS III mutation. The progeny of such carrier/normal cross will either be normal or a carrier, but all will be clinically normal. Ideally, if a DNA tested carrier is bred to a DNA tested normal dog then all of the puppies should be DNA tested early in their life to ascertain which are normal and which are carriers. Experience in other breeds has shown that adopting an approach like this can reduce the mutant gene to the point of irrelevance in the breed within a relatively short time frame. The only caveat that I would add to this is that if the carrier is a dog, then the breed should ensure that such a carrier dog is not used too frequently on DNA tested normal bitches; but this should not happen in the future if breeders adopt the advice offered above to reduce the rate of loss of genetic diversity, particularly point 2.

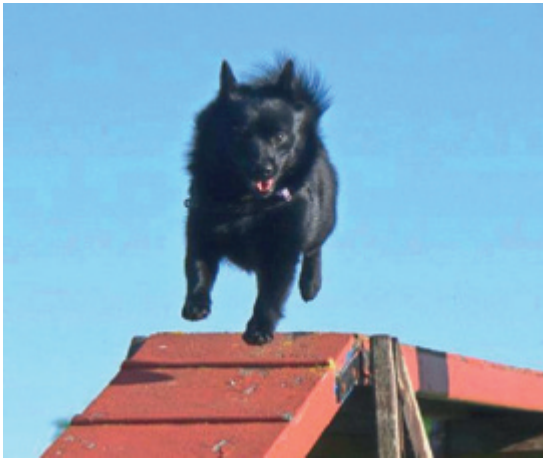

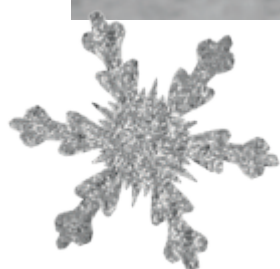
