Treasurer's End of Year Report

Our income for the year has decreased very slightly and there has been an increase in the cost of venues, postage and newsletter printing which has reduced our accumulated funds, but overall we still have a healthy balance. There are Paypal transactions for 2014 which were not transferred until after 31st December 2014 which will then mean we will be about breaking even. Both the open and championship show's incomes added together were much the same as last year (figures shown in brackets)

As many of you will be aware it is now possible to buy items and services on-line using Paypal and over the year we have seen a continued increase in its use. We would encourage a greater use of this facility, particularly from our overseas members, which eliminates the banking of cheques which is particularly time consuming. Rather than show the residue income from the Paypal flat-fee charge I have now included in the totals for the individual items/services.

Our Rescue Fund income has decreased by a small amount reducing the overall balance marginally, but there is donation money still to be transferred from the main account from 2014.

We very much appreciate the continued support and financial generosity of our membership.

ANNUAL HEALTH REPORT 2014

The year 2014 has been very quiet on the health front which, since my lap-top died, taking much of my data to the grave with it, was no bad thing! As ever, of course, the Schipperke still presents as a breed which is fundamentally sound and healthy, with no structural exaggerations.

SECOND BREED HEALTH SURVEY. Unfortunately, this was something of a non-event, with virtually no questionnaires returned. The Health Committee had hoped that a second survey might provide more specific information, perhaps pinpointing conditions, such as cancers, which might be deemed common in the breed and which might, therefore, warrant further exploration. Given the response rate, no further health surveys are envisaged now unless significant other health concerns emerge.

The Kennel Club has recently conducted a health survey of pedigree dogs, however, and a full report will be published next year. Although only 20 Schipperkes participated in the survey, it will be interesting to view the results.

The Royal Veterinary College is also undertaking a large-scale health survey involving all veterinary practices in England. I have indicated that as a breed, we would be interested in being included in the study but it does seem likely that more popular breeds with larger populations will be selected.

<u>EPILEPSY</u>. The Finnish study is ongoing and I plan to have another push for samples from UK dogs soon. At the time of writing, I await a further update from the University of Helsinki.

<u>MPSIIIB</u>. Despite repeated assurances over three years or more, Dr Giger of the University of Pennsylvania has still not published the material on his test for this condition. This means that his premise for the test and his methodology have not been subject to review by other geneticists. I remind him on a regular basis.

Nevertheless, we have not had a known case of this dreadful condition in this country to date. Furthermore, we have not become aware of any incorrect test results for approximately seven years now. Our test result registers on the Club web-site indicate that the MPSIIIB status of progeny is entirely consistent with that of the parents. We have significant numbers of dogs which have tested normal (clear) or are clear by descent and I think there is justification for optimism overall and for continuing confidence in the test itself.

The situation in the U.S., where the problem was arguably more established, is similarly improved. Initially, many breeders there had to include carriers in their breeding plans or risk losing their established lines or, even worse, restricting the breed gene pool, thereby increasing the danger of encountering new health problems. Now, however, the test has identified increasing numbers of clear dogs and breeding from carriers is no longer necessary in many kennels.

<u>KARLTON INDEX.</u> This independent mechanism for evaluating individual breed strategies to highlight and tackle health issues, is currently under review and should be re-launched in the foreseeable future

<u>GENETIC DIVERSITY</u>. This topic remains on the Health Committee's agenda and will be discussed in greater detail in the coming year.

I did think he would have to stay with me forever but along came Gordon. He was devastated at the loss of his schipp and was depressed. I took Sam to Mansfield and it literally was love at first sight.

The Schipperke Club Championship Show 18th October 2014

It was a great honour to be invited to judge at this show and I must thank the Committee for the privilege. The show was held at Shenstone Village Hall which was ideal for this breed, the atmosphere was tremendous, it really felt like a gathering of old friends who had not met for the last year, it was wonderful to see so many sat around for lunch enjoying each other's company.

The show had received an excellent entry of 66 dogs, Best in Show was the Veteran dog "Ch. Schipdale Orlando", Best puppy was just over 8 months "Abylity Nina's Celtic Queen of Turnlaw".

Generally the quality was fairly good save for front movement which seemed to be erratic in quite a lot of dogs, a few toplines were not good and several were quite lengthy, on the whole heads were good, many with the correct eye shape and colour.

Altogether, I had a lovely day.

Puppy Dog (2)

- 1 Cheatham's "Aradet Action Man". Nearly 10 months black, he is of correct size and balance with an excellent head, eye and expression with well placed ears. Well angulated and placed front. Correct rib and topline with well set tail. Stylish on the move with sound rear.
- 2 Davis, "Altintay Maharaja". 11 months black, right up to size. He has an attractive head and expression and is well put together overall, quite brisk on the move with a sound rear.

Junior Dog (1)

1 Davis' "Altintay Maharaja".

Special Yearling (3)

- 1 Butters "Roopec Admire Me". Gold dog with lovely balance and good size, He has the most beautiful expression from his correct "foxy" head, well made in front with correct forechest, correct broad rib and refined quarters. Sound and brisk with good coat.
- 2 Jones' "Roopec Dinky Demon". Black, litter brother to the winner, but lacking his maturity. He has an attractive head and expression, strong and short neck with well laid shoulder. Correct rib, topline and tailset. Sound rear but needs time.

Post Graduate Dog (3)

- 1 Holmes' "Revloch Ed Turner at Dencas". Impressive black with typical outline and good for size. Correct short neck, level topline with well set tail. Good, masculine head with lovely, dark oval eye. Well made overall with sound rear.
- 2 Manners' "Roopec Diamond Black". Good, foxy head with well shaped eye and good ears. Sound, well made front, correct rib, topline and tailset. Well angulated rear just a touch unsteady.
- 3 Bryans' "Schojan Golden Glory". Pleasing in outline with attractive head, quite well put together and brisk on the move.

Limit Dog (4)

- 1 Philpott's "Aradet Expert Timing". Very attractive black with typical outline and good for size. Quite stylish and brisk on the move. He has an excellent head with correct dark brown eye and really well placed ears. Well angulated and placed front with correct forechest. Lovely tight small feet. Correct rib, well set tail sound. In good coat.
- 2 Massey's "Scipsar Sunny Jim at Ristine". Good size, well balanced Gold with a most attractive head, well shaped eye and correct ear. Well placed shoulder, correct rib. Sound, well made rear.
- 3 Muggleton's "Mywulf Flame of Arnor". Stylish gold, up to size. He is quite brisk on the move with well made rear.

Open Dog (4)

- 1 West's "Bahram Hiawatha at Brookwell". Black who is right up to size, I loved his head, expression and ear all combined to give that typical "foxy" appearance. He is correct in front and rear angles with good bone and neat, cat like feet. Strong rib, straight topline with well set tail. Sound and brisk on the move Finished with a good coat. Reserve Dog C.C
- 2 Peck's "Byquy Cabbage". Black who is very typical of the breed, lovely neck and outline. Well shaped "foxy" head and good ears. Well angulated and placed front, correct rib, topline and tailset. Stylish and brisk on the move. Good coat.

Any other Colour (6)

- 1 Mance's "Schipdale Byron". Gold dog who is mature and presents a finished picture. Balanced in skull and muzzle with well shaped, dark eye. Well laid shoulder with excellent upper arm. Correct rib, topline and tailset with well made quarters. Sound and brisk on the move.
- 2 Butters "Roopec Admire Me".
- 3 Massey's "Scipsar Sunny Jim at Ristine".

Veteran Dog under 10 years (2)

- 1 Mances "Ch Schipdale Orlando". 8 year old black who belies his age, he looked a picture with his typical outline, I love his size and balance. He has a correct, masculine "foxy" head with dark, oval eyes finished with correct, erect ears. He is so well put together with his front legs well under the body and refined, well made rear. Absolutely sound and brisk on the move, his full coat completes the picture. Dog C.C, Best of Breed.
- 2 Manners "Komargo's Crazy Diamond at Roopec". Good size black with correct head, eye and expression. Well shaped rib, correctly made, sound rear in good coat.

Veteran Dog over 10 years

- 1 Wilson's "Ch Aradet Off The Chart". This dog was in absolutely fantastic condition. Coat, teeth, muscle all excellent. He has the most lovely head and expression, well angulated in front and rear. Sound both ways and nicely brisk.
- 2 Tricklebank's "Ch Nocte Boris Karloff". Black, 14 years of age, he has an attractive head with really well placed ear. So well made overall, in remarkable condition for his years. Stylish, brisk mover.

Minor Puppy Bitch (3)

Two beauties in first and second places headed by;

- 1 Millar's "Abylity Nina's Celtic Queen of Turnlaw". 8 1/2 months black baby with the most outstanding head, eye and expression, the picture completed by well placed ears. Excellent front angulation, well placed. Good rib, refined, well made rear. Sound, brisk and stylish on the move with a good coat for her age. Best Puppy
- 2 Thorne's "Ryeman Candy Crush at Schipdale". Just 6 months, this black baby shows so much promise, excelled in head eye and expression. So well constructed overall, maybe a touch fine throughout but time is very much on her side.

Puppy Bitch (1)

1 Robjohn's "Aradet Amelia Pond for Qwontox". 9 1/2 months black with outstanding front angulation, matching length upper arm placing her front well under the dog. Very pretty head with dark, oval eye, good topline with well set tail. Sound, well made rear. Stylish mover.

Junior Bitch (2)

1 Robjohn's "Aradet Amelia Pond for Qwontox".

2 Forknall's "Schojan Reve D'Or at Avidore". Quite a close decision between these 2, this gold bitch has so much to admire right from her typical outline, beautiful head and stylish movement, she has it all but just needs to firm up.

Special Yearling Bitch (1)

1 Manners "Roopec Birthday Treasure". This black bitch has a correct outline and is of good size. Her front angulation is excellent with correct forechest, she has a correct, dark, oval eye and good ears. Correct in rib and topline with well set tail. Well angulated, sound rear, brisk on the move with good coat.

Post Graduate Bitch (6)

- 1 Leafs "Chadbower Bonnie Rye". This gold bitch captivated me, she has the most typical outline and is of correct size and balance. I loved her head, everything comes together with her really feminine "foxy" head, excellent eye and expression with well placed ears. She is a delight to go over seen in her sound and brisk movement. In good coat. If her handler just realized what she was here for she should go right to the top. Reserve Bitch C.C.
- 2 Fegan's "Wagaman Black Magic". This black bitch has a beautiful head and eye, not quite the balance of the winner but she is quite nicely angled in front and rear, with good broad rib and straight topline.

 3 Massey's "Carozza Black Lace at Ristine". She is stylish and brisk on the move and has a dark oval eye, is
- satisfying to go over but today left her coat at home, nevertheless her type won her this place.

Limit Bitch (5)

- 1 Tricklebank' "Nocte Elvira". Impressive black bitch, up to size but nicely cobby. She has an excellent head with beautiful expression, I loved her extrovert temperament. Balanced in shoulder and upper arm on a good rib. Refined, sound rear, brisk and stylish.
- 2 Davis "Byquy Eye Candy". This black bitch certainly is sweet to see with her super head and expression, correct ears complete the picture. She is well made in front and rear with good bone. Has a correct topline with well set tail. Sound rear.
- 3 Massey's "Scipsar Alice In Wonderland at Ristine". She has an outstanding eye in a head which is correctly balanced. She is well made overall but today was just unsteady on the move and left her coat at home.

Open Bitch (8)

- 1 Bugg's "Byquy Black Carat". A picture standing and does not disappoint on the move, she has a true, typical outline, small and cobby with correct neck and topline. I loved her feminine head, excellent eye, expression and ear. A delight to go over, sound and brisk on the move with good bone and good feet. She was in full coat. Bitch C.C, I was delighted that she was made up on the day.
- 2 Hart & Hawkins' "Ch Carozza Last Orders". She is a delightful bitch with a truly excellent head and eye again she is "classic" in size and outline, has an extrovert temperament and is so well put together. I admired her brisk movement, she looked a picture.
- 3 Deats "Am Ch Ebonorth Never On A Sunday". Cobby and classical in outline, she is of correct size. I loved her head and eye, feminine and foxy. A pleasure to go over with her correct angles. She was in full coat.

Any Other Colour Open (2)

- 1 Leafs "Chadbower Bonnie Rye".
- 2 Reed's "Ch Byquy Lilley The Pink". Gold bitch, so sound both ways, she has very feminine head, excellent neck, topline and tailset. So well put together front and rear. A really classic outline in good coat.

Veteran Bitch Under 10 Years (3)

- 1 Hart& Hawkins' "Ch Carozza Molly Malone with Ludwyn". She is of correct size and nicely cobby, has a correct outline, neck and topline. Classic feminine head. She is well made in front with a correct, refined rear. Sound both ways with style. A lovely girl in good coat.
- 2 West's "Ch / Am Ch Shalako's The Last Rose at Bahram". Outstanding in head, eye and expression, she is of correct size with good, rather short neck and straight topline. Very pleasing to go over, brisk and stylish on the move.
- 3 Wearing's "Aradet Party Politics". This black bitch has a very pretty head with excellent ears, she is of good size and balance with correct rib and sound, well made rear.

Veteran Bitch over 10 years (8)

- 1 Robjohns' "Qwontox Celtic Quest". Sh CM. A lovely pensioner with super feminine head, outstanding eye and correct ears. She is well angulated in front, well placed with forechest. Correct in topline and well made, sound rear. In good coat.
- 2 Forknall's "CH Avidore Detroit Miss". The first 2 were so close, this black bitch has a very pretty, foxy head with well shaped eye. She is again, well made throughout with correct neck and topline, the winners soundness tipped the balance. Incredible though for over 14 years of age.
- 3 Forknall's "CH Avidore Fancy Pants". Very striking black bitch, she is correct for size and balance but on occasions losing her topline today. She has such a correct, feminine head with really well shaped, dark eye. Well angled front and rear. A nice bitch.

Special Yearling Dog or Bitch (5,1)

- 1. Millar's Abylity Nina's Celtic Queen of Turnlaw. 8.5 mo bitch. My notes say 'naughty, but nice'! Loved her 'foxy' expression good head with neat ears. Nice for size and showing a very pleasing outline standing. Good angulation fore and aft, sufficient bone, tail set on well. Good puppy coat in very good condition. On the move she was parallel and very sound. A quality puppy.
- 2. Jones' Roopec Dinky Demon. 20 mo dog. Good head and neck and shoulder placement. Liked his size and overall square outline, short back, neat rear and sufficient bone. Good harsh coat in lovely condition. Partial tail. His good construction showed on the move which was brisk and true.
- 3. Robjohns' Aradet Amelia Pond for Qwontox. 10 mo bitch. Very pretty young lady with lovely head and expression. Nicely constructed with good outline, but not as forward as 1 in development at the moment. Very sound with lovely parallel movement.

Special Limit Dog or Bitch (5,1)

- 1. Manners' Roopec Diamond Black. 3 yo dog. Attractive head with neat ears and lovely dark oval eyes. Loved his overall square shape and correct shoulder placement. Good broad chest and sound rear. Moved well and with precision.
- 2. Tricklebank's Nocte Elvira. 5 yo bitch. Very naughty young lady but very sound on the move which gave her this placing. Small and with pleasing outline; good coat and well covered tail which was carried nicely when she remembered to put it up.
- 3. Fegan's Wagaman Black Magic. 2 yo bitch. Thought this young lady would be my winner when I first saw her as she made a lovely picture standing. Lovely head and expression, sufficient neck and good front. Did not always maintain her topline and her movement was not as tidy as 1 and 2.

Special Open Dog or Bitch (5)

- 1. Manners' Komargo's Crazy Diamond at Roopec. I see this boy is father to my Limit winner. 8.5 yo dog of nice size and lovely overall square shape. Good in head with correct ears and oval eye. I felt the words 'small, cobby and active' really fitted him. Broad chest and lighter rear giving characteristic outline. So sound on the move.
- 2. Robjohns' Qwontox Quintessential Sh.CM. Feminine head with great foxy expression. Balanced outline with good chest development, short in back and sound rear; well set tail. Lovely parallel movement showing in both out and back and correct side gait.
- 3. Fegan's Carozza Just A Madam at Wagaman. Good head with correct oval eye shape and pleasing expression. Everything in the right place and sound on the move, but just felt that I would have liked a little more of her.

Schipperke Obreedience Team Journey

After the October Schipperke Club show at Shenstone Village Hall, we assembled with our little treasurers and attempted to do heelwork in line formation. After only a few attempts it became apparent that it was possible. So a plan was hatched to have another practice and work through not just the heelwork but the set exercises. We really needed to know how we were going to split these exercises up between us. So we had a practice in Dudley but only 3 of us could make it. But at least we managed to divide the exercises up and start to work on the exercises the dogs didn't know.

Audition day at Stoneleigh arrived, fortuitously teams were running in alphabetical order, so we had time to have a run through of the group heelwork together. The first time we had managed this with the selected team of Janice Philpott & Zorro, Bev Manners & Syd, Chris Moss & Percy, myself & Eski, so we needed to work out the best formation. Amazingly, the heelwork audition went well and out of the 20 teams, I thought we were one of the top 5. After a quick lunch the teams, again in alphabetical order, went through the four set exercises. Eski breezed the scent exercise, whilst Percy easily did retrieve the dumbbell – but we would expect these two dogs to do well as they have both won out of Novice in Obedience. Percy has been seconded out of retirement for this competition. Syd didn't do too bad a job of the recall and stop considering the amount of time he's had to train. Likewise, Zorro made a valiant attempt at the go to bed exercise. Being the inexperienced dogs they found the smells on the floor a little distracting, but did very well considering the behaviours of some of the dogs in the other teams.

The feedback from some of the other teams and the Kennel Club officials was very positive. We were told we needed to change our trouser colour so that the dogs stood out. So we knew if we were selected we shouldn't wear black trousers!

Twelve teams were selected for the Obreedience competition at Crufts, of which we were one!!!! We were thus invited to the Rehearsal day at the KC Building at Stoneleigh in February. The final team and reserve had to be decided to send in our official entry. We had a few options but decided that Mandy Rollinson & Isla were our best candidates. Rehearsal day was the first time that we all managed to meet up. Our first heelwork rehearsal was not our best but we were able to do this again later in the day and thankfully put in a polished performance. However, Schipps being Schipps the individual exercises were quite catastrophic, so we just hope that they got it out of their system before the big day at Crufts. It was equally reassuring to see other teams having problems. The day is essentially a rehearsal for all involved including the Kennel Club staff, the Judge & her ring party & the teams.

Undoubtedly, the biggest problem has been deciding what to wear. To ensure that we had identical colours we knew that one of us should purchase our outfits from the same supplier. Janice volunteered and then facebook messages and emails have been going back and forth regarding colours, wording, design and critically sizes! Mandy managed to get a brilliant deal for the poloshirts and Penny Fludder has made us some fabulous leads in the Belgian flag colours, which the Club have kindly sponsored.

So Saturday 7th March, Hall 5 in the Obedience Ring the teams will parade at 4pm. The teams will be working in the following order: 1) Novia Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever; 2) Pyrenenean Sheepdog; 3) Shetland Sheepdog; 4) Chiuahua; 5) Whippet; 6) Australian Shepherds; 7) Smooth Collie; 8) Mini Schnauzer; 9) Japanese Akita Inu; 10) Toy Poodle; 11) Schipperke; 12) Lhaso Apso.

SCHIPPERKE GROUP WINNERS

The Utility Group is, arguably, the most diverse and exotic of the seven which make up the classification at UK dog shows. It contains wide variations on the canine form, many with no obvious connection to each other and includes many glamorous and striking breeds such as the Poodles, Akitas and Lhasa Apsos. Needless to say, a number of Utility breeds seem to fare consistently badly in this eye-catching company, breeds like the Boston Terrier, Schnauzer, Japanese Spitz and our own Schipperke. 2014, however, has been very different for us and I thought it might be diverting at this point to acknowledge those few dogs which have carried the banner for the breed at Ch Group level over the years.

The first Utility group winner came from the famous Schippland kennel of Mr and Mrs Laurence Ludford, CH. (and later N.Z. CH) Cracker of Schippland. By CH. Blackberry of S ex Chloe of S, Cracker was a neat, balanced little dog, very typy and sound but not necessarily with the flamboyance which seems to carry such weight in the Group competition. Not a "big ring dog" in to-day's parlance. Nevertheless, he topped the lot at Three Counties in 1971 under Percy Whittaker, while still a puppy! He was followed shortly afterwards the same year by his kennel-mate, CH (and later N.Z. CH.) Night Dive of S. By CH. Tar Dip of S ex Hallbower Duskie Rose of S, he became our second winner under Jimmy James at Belfast.

The third Group winner was Dorothy Seaton's CH Seacross Rogue (S. Sir Henry ex S. Zara), Group winner at Birmingham in 1975 where Ethel Taylor-Jackson judged the breed and George Leatt the Group. According to an early Seacross advert, Rogue also took third spot in the Group with his first ticket. Quite an achievement for a small, home-based kennel and with a dog who was fairly laid-back in his approach to life.

While a number of Schips have survived to reach the Group short-list, including Reserve (now Group 2) over the years, we waited until 1977 and the arrival of Ch Pudi of Moorehaven, a South African import shown by Len Hammond, to see the breed recognised at Group level again. At BUBA in 1978, he was RBIS under Reg Gadsden, at the same show where Jacky Langhorn's future champion Aerokens Lemma was Best Minor Puppy and Reserve Best Puppy in Show. Quite a highlight day for the breed!

Pudi, by S.A. CH.Moorehaven Billy Budd ex S.A. CH. Bambi of Moorehaven, attracted notice in the big ring in the days when there was only a Group winner and Reserve and he took the latter position on 5 separate occasions. Remarkably, he was short-listed in all of the 28 Groups in which he appeared. To crown a remarkable year in 1979, he was Best in Group at Bath, being given the nod there by Harry Jordan.

Pudi gave the breed its biggest boost at Bath again, two years later when, also under Harry Jordan, he took the Group before going on to be declared BIS by Maurice Gilliatt. To date, he remains our only General Ch show BIS winner. Who will follow in his footsteps?

It was ten years later, in 1991, that our next winner emerged in the shape of CH. Hallbower Hans, owned by Jeff and Sandra Sampson, daughter of our President, Anne Chadwick. Hans was home-bred by CH. H. Harvey out of H. Roseamerica and took the Group at Darlington under Andrew Brace. Incidentally, Hans won 26 CCs and was victorious in a heat of the

Pedigree Chum Veteran Stakes at WKC in 1993 under Di Johnson, another sphere of competition where the breed is often under-represented on the winner's rostrum.

Coming more up to date, we currently have the successes of CH/AM CH. Chatelet Aradet Rugby owned by Trish Morley and co-bred by Mary Deats out of her AM/CH. Aradet Opera Singer by AM/CH Daydream Chatelet Secret Powers. Jordy was BIS at our Group show, BUBA in 2010 under Ann Ingram and then topped the Group again this year at Richmond under Mark Cocozza. In addition, he won the overall heat of the Eukanuba CH Stakes at City of Birmingham and flew the breed flag in the grand final in October. At BUBA in December, he topped the CH Stakes again, so will be returning to the finals in 2015 for a second attempt.

Mention of Mary Deats suggests that I should cheat a little and record not a Group win but a very creditable G2 at that most prestigious of shows, Crufts in 2000 with CH. Franhowil Black Minstrel for Aradet. A superb achievement and the highest accolade for the breed so far at this special show.

Finally, we have the amazing feat of a Schip winning two Groups on the trot, almost as soon as he arrived on these shores earlier this year. AM.CH Beachviews Dark Knight, piloted by "the McLachlan girls", Joanne and Lindsay, won the Group at WKC under Jean Lanning and snatched the same award a week or so later at SKC from Jeff Luscott, the breed judge at Welsh Kennel Club. An import from the kennel of J. Penatello and J. Plourde in the U.S and by AM.CH Delamer Nauti By Nature ex AM.CH. Delamer Burning Desire, this chap has really drawn attention to the Schipperke in 2014, contributing to a year which might justifiably be called "the year of the Schipperke"!

Now all we need is a bitch and/or a cream winner. Our breed record holder, CH. Keyna's Swansong, featured in Group short-lists but never made it to the top spot. So come on girls, it's all to play for!

And an INTERESTING FOOTNOTE! While researching this article, I contacted Dr Desiree Scott, a true mine of historical canine information. She casually mentioned that there had been a Schip BIS winner at a General Ch show in the UK in 1901, information which left me gasping. Apparently this momentous win took place at Mallow Ch show in Co. Cork, S. Ireland. Eire was still part of Great Britain until 1920 and in 1901, the breed was pretty popular, given its novelty value and was routinely classified at many shows. At Mallow, the winner was a gloriously named fellow called KATAWAMPAS, which I thought sounded like a Native American name but which apparently is an obsolete word meaning to walk crookedly or out of alignment. Not one to bestow on a promising pup, perhaps!!

According to the KC Stud Book of the period, Katawampas was bred by a Mrs Hoskins in May, 1900 by Prince El Dorado (a son of the famous El Dorado possibly?) out of Dame Trot, herself by an unregistered sire. He was owned by a Miss Whiting and I suspect was based in Ireland. There were no tickets at Mallow and, in fact, it appears that Katawampas never won a big green card at all. After his spectacular win, he was second in Limit at the People's Palace (Pet and Foreign Dog Show) the same year, then in 1902, had third places in Open and Limit at Liverpool, third in Open at Dublin, then third in Limit at Cork. Then he vanishes. 5 minutes of fame!!





COLOURED SCHIPPERKES

I recently acquired a copy of E.B.Holmes' book on the breed published in 1934, a copy which appears to have been owned by a Mrs Lymer who was a Club member in the 1950s. Enclosed in the book are a number of newspaper clippings and I thought that the following might be of interest. It appeared in "Our Dogs" on 14th November, 1952 and was written by Macdonald Daly, a prominent all-rounder of the day. It is entitled "Colour-Bred Whites – But Schipperkes". It is accompanied by a photograph of the S. African breeder, Mr Begemann with three white puppies and their parents. (Despite what Mr Daly says, both adults, by to-day's standards, look rather big and plain to me!!).

"Causing considerable stir in South Africa, when I was over there, was a litter of Schipperkes bred by Mr Alf Begemann of East London. The sire of the litter was a dog named Ch. Oberon's Black Magic, a highly typical black specimen which I awarded a challenge certificate at Johannesburg. The dam was a black bitch, Ch Ranmores Irish Rose of Oberon, which the late Sandy Dalzell, when he was out there, awarded 3rd in a non-sporting class of 26 exhibits.

It was a son-and-mother mating. The resultant litter consisted of two black dogs and three white bitches and Mr Begemann said to me: "I was quite staggered, because all previous matings between these two had resulted in nothing but blacks, and I could trace nothing but pitch-black Schips right back through their pedigrees."

The white puppies were of normal, excellent conformation, with well-set dark eyes and beautiful coats, frills, culottes and ears. I mentioned them in my report of the Johannesburg show, and the sequel has been a most interesting letter from Mrs V. Carr-Whitaker, F.Z.S. who writes from Windsor (England) with information which I have just air-mailed to Mr Begemann.

Mrs Whitaker has shown and bred Schipperkes for nearly 36 years and has taken special interest in the "coloured ones". She won a lot with creams before the war, after that colour had been accepted by the Kennel Club. At the time when the Kennel Club would accept only blacks, the coloureds were drowned at birth – "a great pity" says Mrs Whitaker, "for the creams, blues, sables, livers and blacks are all as natural to Schips as to their cousins, the Poms."

Mrs Whitaker remembers how that great old breeder, the late Mr Banner of Ferryhill, Co. Durham (whom I remember so well as a fount of information on our journeys to and from shows) mated two of his best blacks and early one morning found that the bitch had produced one black puppy, one blue, two creams and a brown. Mrs Whitaker introduced the Banner blood in to her kennel to get coloureds but with no luck.

This year, although she had decided to retire from active breeding, she mated her black bitch, Rainworth Ritzy-Bear, to Mr Langton's cream dog, Sensation of Oldway. The result was two blacks and two greys".

(I was interested to see Sensation described as being "cream". All other descriptions have him as white with black points". I wonder if the "greys" became blues – or even muddy blacks?!"

LKA CH SHOW 2014 SCHIPPERKES

The entry was quite small, but as a breed specialist whose breeding is owned by a number of other exhibitors, as a result, the entry was limited. Of the nine males entered, seven were present. The bitches fielded a better outcome with 17 of the 19 present. I found only one example of dentition that was not as per the standard, and coats were quite excellent in harsh texture and density. Size variation for me was a real conundrum. I don't understand how a breed which requires it's specimens to be 'small, cobby' and a weight of 12 to 16 pounds and could have such a wide range in such a small entry. At a guess, I think there was one entrant around 10-11 pound and several over 18 pounds with one possibly topping 20 pounds. Leg length was quite varied. Having a dog high on the leg, would be its very nature then tend to have a longer back so as to square it off, as it were.

- MPD (1) Thorne's Schipdale Lewis, black 7 month old dog, is already at such a young age well up on leg, so with development, as the chest broadens and deepens, the overall outlook will be more balanced in time. He has a very bright and enquiring expression, lovely high ear set, dark almond shaped eyes, very little stop. For me, I would prefer less length of muzzle. He has a good front, legs are fine with good bone right down to neat feet. Body will come on of course coat is a very long puppy coat right now, so demarcation not too clear. As we all know, however, the puppy coat is only the prelude, so I personally don't really take too much into account what the puppy coat looks like as it often changes dramatically with the big moult later on. Overall good angles fore and aft, very good tailset and just needs time to settle in gait.
- PD (2,1) 1 Reid's Cachwell Funtime, 10 month old black dog of ideal size, proportion and balance, but oh my, is he well named? Or perhaps his owner will live to regret it! Lovely head and expression, excellent balance of skull to muzzle, excellent eyes and lovely set on ears, good front, though a bit narrow at this time, will need time to develop in body as well. He is well ribbed back with short loin, balanced height to length, has a correct top line though tail set is a tad low. On the move, when he decided not to have such 'fun,' I could see correct and true movement. He is a truly 'intensely lively and alert' Schip BPD
- PGD (1) Bryan's Schojan Golden Glory, 2 year old deep r/g male, attractive outline presenting s small compact dog with overall good balance. He is on the smaller end of size, but still within the standard and has a foxy expression, good ear set, dark oval eyes, very good neck, good front, legs, tight catlike feet, very good harsh textured coat, correct top line, excellent tail set. Due to other interesting scents in the ring, it was very difficult to assess the movement of this dog.
- OD (2) A class of great variance between the two entered. 1. West's Bahram Hawatha at Brookwell, 5 year old black dog. I have to say that I considered him to be much larger than I would like, but having said that he is balanced, but could do with losing a pound or two on his body. Very good head and expression, dark oval eyes, well placed ears used to advantage, good neck, ribbing, strong loin, bone in balance to body and has tight catlike feet, harsh coat texture, very good top line, very good tail set, balanced angles fore and aft and this showed in his very collected and sound gait.
- RCC; 2 Mance's Schipdale Byron, a 3 years gold dog, for me much more the size I would prefer, as he is a moderately sized male. He is losing coat right now and due to the winter months, has lost the pigment as well. He has however, a lovely head and expression, neat ears well used and oval eyes which we showing some staining on the day. His muzzle and skull are correctly proportioned and shaped, though I found him a bit short in neck and a tad upright in the shoulder. He has a compact body with short loin and tail set could be a bit higher. Very good gait front and side.
- VD (1) Mance's Ch Schipdale Orlando, well this is the third time I have Judged this dog and he has always done very well under me, so again today, there was no other in the offering to challenge. He is now almost nine years old, yet still retains the correct pear shape body, compact and cobby with substance and short loin and wonderful spring of rib, along with good front and rear angles. His head continues to be one of his most excellent points with excellent ears, lovely eyes, correct balance of skull to muzzle with sufficient modelling and fill under the eyes to give such an overall truly beautiful head. This is topped with such a harsh jacket having abundant and dense standing off ruff and mane. His rear gate is excellent and if he is not moved too fast, the front action is

adequate. I especially liked his broad chest and deep brisket, something that seems to take time to develop in the breed these days, as so many are shallow and narrow in that area. Overall an excellent example of the breed and I had no hesitation in awarding him the CC & BOB.

GCD(1) 1 Robjohns' Quontox Quincy, 4 years old black dog, masculine expression, good ear set, dark eyes, very good front and rear angles, very good bone, excellent feet, excellent harsh textured coat. As he is quite high on the leg, the desired compact balance is not quite there for me. On the move is true and fore aft with steady sound gait, tail is well carried, but could be higher set.

- MPB(3) 1 Fellows' Nocte Almerina At Blackshuck, my find of the day, just a baby a 7 month old bitch, with the most delightful feminine head having excellent dark eyes, with good fill under eyes, lovely ear set, combining to give her a real 'classic feminine head'. She has correct front and rear angles, very good bone right down to fairly tight feet, coat texture is harsh but fairly long,, compact body with short loin is of course quite raw, tail is a tad low set, but overall a very promising youngster, moved the best of any of the puppies today so no hesitation on making her BPB and BP.
- 2 Mance's Ryeman Charley Girl, 8 month old black bitch, slightly different type but still has a typical and expressive feminine head with good overall proportions to skull and muzzle, lovely dark eyes more oval than round, very good ear set, good front on her with balanced bone leading to tight neat feet, well ribbed back, good coat texture, is not quite as compact as class winner and would like a slightly higher tail set.
- 3 Tricklebank's Nocte Atalanta.
- PB (2) 1 Millar's Ability Nina's Celtic Queen of Turnlaw, 10 month old black bitch, well up to size, does not need to grow on anymore. She has a feminine head, dark eyes which could be more oval, could do with a shade more fill under the eyes and a tad more width to muzzle, but she has well set ears, very good neck, correct close harsh coat still with sufficient demarcation. Her bone is balanced for her size and is strong right down to her tight feet, strong body already, level top line, excellent tail set and use of. She is intensely lively and alert and shows good movement.

 2 Nocte Atalanta, 7 month old black bitch who was third in MPB, has a most delightfully feminine head and expression, can see at a glance that she carries many of the same attributes as the class winner as they are littermates. She also has a beautiful body shape on the table, but is very raw and today was lacking in sufficient confidence in the environment to show off her attributes.
- JB (1) 1 Forknall's Schojan Reve D'or at Avidore, 15 month old small compact gold bitch, having dark eyes, correct head properties for skull and muzzle, excellent ear set, giving the foxy expression. Currently has a 'winter nose'. She has correct forehand, bone in balance to her body and size, lovely tight cat like feet, good coat texture. When she concentrates on the job at hand, stands foursquare giving a lovely compact out line and on the move has an excellent tail set with very sound movement coming and going.
- PGB (5) This was a very strong class, many of these bitches should be shown up in limit or open I think! The first three in this class I was so pleased to find the desired pear shaped body, hope others will notice as well, as I rate all three excellent for breed type!
- 1 Leaf's Chadbower Bonnie Rye, 3 year old gold bitch, a well built substantial girl, but for me is one of the few bitches today with required compact cobby body with substance, width of brisket and depth of chest, yet is very balanced overall. Yes we all can see she is out of coat, but her excellent conformation is there to see, with legs well under the body, excellent gait, lovely head and expression, very good ear set on and size, would like a shade more fill under the eyes and a bit more on the muzzle, but her conformation is correct, she has excellent coat texture, lovely high tail set, very balanced movement on coming and going, correct body shape, overall a very pleasing picture. 3 Massey's Carozza Black Lace at Ristine.
- LB (1) Bryans' Trijem Ultrasonic, year old black bitch, not quite in full coat today, but this did not disguise her good body shape, but I think perhaps a half pound off would be to advantage. She has a feminine expression which would be enhanced by better use of ears, but perhaps the noisy venue may have affected her. She is another one with a lovely pear shaped body, wider in front and lighter in rear quarters, but due to her weight, tends to be wide in front standing and on the move,

though has a very good rear and side gait. Good top line and a well rounded rear, very good feet and good tail set.

OB Forknall's Ch Avidore Hot Gossip, six and a half year old black bitch, medium sized compact bitch who's out line is very balanced giving a very balanced giving an excellent overall look with correct front, level top line, very good tail, balanced angles fore and aft. She has a very good head and expression but would still prefer darker eyes and more oval than round. Other than that I find her quite typical for breed type, having excellent conformation, legs well under the body, chest down to elbows, good spring of rib, very good coat texture with correct demarcation on her dense coat which is close to the body, she has a short strong loin, another one with a pear shaped body, but I wonder if this is something that in some lines just takes time to develop. Tail set is excellent and well used and movement is spot on. No hesitation in awarding her the CC.

2 Bugg's Byquy Black Carat, 2 year old black bitch, needs to mature more in the body insofar as depth of chest and spring of rib. She presents a bright, alert and outgoing expression, with well set and used ears, eyes are dark but fairly round and would like a bit more fill under the eyes. She has overall a very nicely balanced body proportions being well ribbed back and with maturity will improve the spring of rib and depth of chest. Very good coat texture and excellent tail set, I think the best on display today. She has bone in balance to her body but would like tighter feet, has a very sound gait in all directions.

3 Reid's Roshaana Jocasta.

GCB (1) Robjohns Quontox Quintessential, black bitch almost 7 years of age and wearing her age very lightly, but not at all surprised in this breed. She is very well put together for conformation and the resulting gait is as expected. She is a big girl with a strong heat that has very dark eyes that could be a tad more oval than round, very good ear set, clean neck, well set on shoulders and legs well under body, very well developed strong loin, and topped with a harsh close fitting jacket and very good tail set. Strongly mad all through out, and quite high in the leg.

I was asked if I could write a small article for the Newsletter on how I became interested in Schipperkes and I have now been loitering down memory lane for days!
