The Schipperke Club Open Show 30th March 2014

Many thanks to exhibitors for their lovely entry (60+), sadly depleted by absentees. I had some lovely dogs and bitches to go over especially in the veteran bitch classes. I was surprised to find so many mouth faults though and very few had the correct texture of coat. My BIS was the open bitch winner who I thought epitomised the breed standard especially with her constantly wagging tail.

JUNIOR DOG 2 (1)

1. Butters' ROOPEC ADMIRE ME - 15 month gold. Lovely head with dark eyes and good pigmentation, ears and profile with correct demarcations to coat. A little short in upper arm and upright in shoulder. Neat feet-needs to mature in body. Moved ok.

SPECIAL YEARLING DOG 2 (1)

1. Whales' ARADET ZEUS AT ROSHANNA - 18 mth black –Most beautiful head and expression with dark oval eyes and correct bite. Lovely profile with abundant coat with correct demarcations. Good angulations and cobby body. Could have tighter feet. Slightly wide coming and going in movement.

POST GRADUATE DOG 3 (BEST COLOURED IN SHOW)

1. Muggleton's MYWULF FLAME OF ARNOR - 5 yr cream- this boy has taken time to mature. Decent length of leg giving a good profile. Lovely head though nose lacking a little pigment. Very dark oval eyes, neat ears (when he used them) and correct dentition. Very good construction with good upper arm and shoulder placement. Body has now developed. Very good mover.

2. Whales' ARADET ZEUS AT ROSHANNA.

3. Manners' ROOPEC DIAMOND BLACK - 2 ½ yr old black. Pleasing head and expression with broad skull with dark eyes and alert good ears. Slightly longer cast and would like better front. Correct demarcations to coat and good condition with good tail and set. Moved well.

LIMIT DOG 8 (4)

1. Philpott's ARADET EXPERT TIMING - 3 yr old black - Lovely masculine head with dark eyes and neat ears and excellent bite. Good body and cobbiness. Excellent coat inc good culottes and correct demarcations. Well constructed with a little more length of leg to give better profile than 2. Moved out well.

2. Fludder's ARADET XTRA ADDITIION – Litter brother to 1 with slightly better construction in front but stands longer in profile than 1. Excellent head with dark expressive eyes and neat ears. In lovely condition. Moved well.

3. Muggleton's ARADET WIZARD OF OZ AMONGST MYWULF – nearly 4 yr cream masculine strong head with lovely expression and dark eyes. Slight lack of pigment today. Cobby with good angulation would just like less width of chest and slightly longer legs to give more balance.

OPEN DOG 2 (1)

1. Holmes' IR CH SCHIPDALE DICKENS FOR DENCAS - 2 yr black. Larger dog giving a good balanced profile. Nice head with good dark eye. Is well constructed and still has some maturing to do. Would prefer more bone throughout. Moved and handled very well.

A.O.C OPEN DOG 3 (2)

1. Massey's SCIPSAR SUNNY JIM AT RISTINE - 5 yr cream. Neat head with lovely dark eyes and pigment. Well constructed and moved well. Would like smaller feet and is slightly long cast for balance. Not happy today with dropped tail.

VETERAN DOG (under 10) BEST DOG AND BOS

1. Fludder's ARADET SHOT IN THE DARK - 71/2 yr black. Small cobby docked dog with lovely outline in balance and proportion. Excellent angles and construction which shows in his movement. Slightly harsh well demarcated coat. He seems to have bodied up at last. Lovely kind expression on his broad skulled head would like a darker eye but has correct bite. Outgoing temperament and moved soundly.

2. Manners' KAMARGO CRAZY DIAMOND AT ROOPEC nearly 8 yrs black. Docked. Lovely profile but losing top line at times. Well constructed with a kind eye. Good typy schip – moved and showed well.

VETERAN DOG (over 10) RBD

Tricklebank's CH NOCTE BORIS KARLOFF – black at 13 ½ yrs this handsome boy still has his outline to strive for. Although just beginning to show his age in his face (teeth) he still has an excellent expression and dark eye. Excellent expression and dark eye. Excellent construction which showed in his lovely movement. Good top line small neat feet.
Muggleton's MYWULF FARAMIR'S DREAM - 12 yrs black. Smaller framed dog with lovely correct coat in texture and closeness. Lovely head and expression with dark eyes. Just a tad long cast and beginning to show his age. Well handled.

JUNIOR HANDLING CLASS 6-11 YRS

3 smart young ladies well done to you all.

1. Leah Scales 10 yrs. Very good handler attentive and competent with an experienced dog. In control at all times and at one with her dog. BEST J H

2. Lauren Huyton 11 yrs. Very attentive and talked to her dog - good triangle – just not quite assured as Leah.

3. Millie Plant 6 yrs. Not quite tall enough to keep her slightly uncooperative dog still on the table but wasn't fazed – should do well with practice.

MINOR PUPPY BITCH 2

1. Forknall's SCHOJAN REVE D'OR AT AVIDORE – BPIS

These 2 litter sisters of 6 months were a delight – one cream and one black. Very similar but the cream has more maturity and coat. Good dark pigment and lovely small feet. Well constructed and correct demarcation to coat. Would like smaller ears but ell set. Moved very well. 2. Welch's SCHOJAN REVE DE NUIT ARI pretty head with lovely dark eye which could be a little les round. Lots to like with good construction and angulation. Jacket coming on and moved very well.

PUPPY BITCH 1

1. Holmes' SCHIPDALE MIA BLING FOR DENCAS - 9 months black – Gave a good outline on standing but has a lot of maturing to do. Slightly narrow throughout with fine bone. Erratic movement. In good condition and expertly handled.

JUNIOR BITCH 2

1. Allington's HEBWORTH OPAL FOR REXFORD – gold. Just out of puppy, lovely outline. Excellent head with dark eyes and pigment. Well constructed. Ample jacket with good demarcation, good feet. Alert very good mover.

2. Manners' ROOPEC BIRTHDAY TREASURE - 15 month black, longer cast than 1. Pretty head with dark eye, good coat and condition. Moving well and well handled.

SPECIAL YEARLING BITCH 3 (1)

1. Reid's CATWELL RAPTURE - 17 months black.

2. Massey's CARROZA BLACK LACE AT RISTINE - 20 month black. These two lovely bitches had little to separate them – 1 scoring in coat on the day. Both had good profiles, lovely heads with correct dentition and dark eyes and kind expressions. Both are well constructed with good feet and tail sets. Both moved very well.

POST GRADUATE BITCH 7 (1)

1. Wearing's ARADET XOTIC DANCER - 3 yrs black. Lovely head with dark eye and wicked expression. This bitch moves as a schip should brisk and true. Excellent construction. Would just prefer a little more leg for balance. Excellent jacket and condition.

2. Hardy's BYQUY THYME AT PALMOSA - 2 yr black. Sweet bitch who does not always give of her best. Good head with dark eye and good ears. Good construction and body and bone. Excellent jacket and condition, moved very well.

3. Bugg's BYQUY BLACK CARAT - 16 month black. Much to like – lovely outline – good body and coat. Good condition. Moved well, just preferred heads of 1&2.

LIMIT BITCH 7 (4)

1. Massey's SCIPSAR ALICE IN WONDERLAND AT RISTINE- Nearly 3 yrs black. Good outline, well constructed in lovely correctly demarcated coat. Pretty head with dark eye and lively expression, correct bite. Good condition moved and showed very well.

 Hart & Hawkins CARROZA LAST ORDERS - 2 yrs black. Very similar to 1, well constructed and moved well, full of life and lovely coat and condition, excellent tail set, just preferred head of winner.
Manners SCIPSAR BLACK MAGIC AT ROOPEC - 4 yrs black. Sweet head and expression, lovely dark eye. Not so well constructed as 1 & 2 with a wider front which affected movement. Good feet good condition and showed well.

OPEN BITCH 2 BEST BITCH AND BEST IN SHOW

1. Tricklebank's NOCTE ELVIRA nearly 5 yrs black. Have not seen this bitch look so well as she did today, lively and alert and full of herself. Beautiful head with ex bite, dark eyes, good ears and wicked expression. Excellent in outline cobby and so well constructed. Moved with animation brisk and true, just loved her.

2. Forknall's CH AVIDORE HOT GOSSIP - 6 yrs black. Another lively bitch full of quality. Pretty head with ex bite, would just like a darker eye. So well constructed and in ex coat and condition, moved very well.

A.O.C BITCH 2

1. Allingtons HEPWORTH OPAL FOR REXFORD

2. Leaf's CHADBOWER BONNY RYE - 2 ½ yrs cream. Larger bitch, not too happy on the table today. Dark eye with lovely expression. Good coat with demarcations. Moved and showed well.

VETERAN BITCH under 10 yrs 4 (1) RESERVE BEST IN SHOW AND BEST VETERAN IN SHOW

1. Wearing's ARADET PARTY POLITICS - 8 ½ yrs Black. Lively and alert not looking or acting her age. Super outline with pear shaped body. Lovely head and expression with dark eyes and correct bite. Excellent overall construction with correct coat and demarcations, just a lovely typical ship.

2. Hart & Hawkins CH CAROZZA MOLLY MALONE WITH LUDWYN - 8 ½ yrs black. Just beginning to look her age and didn't seem too happy today. Lovely head with dark eyes and neat ears. Good outline just slightly longer cast. Moved very well.

3. Muggleton's CH REXFORD ROYAL ICING OVER MYWULF - 8 ½ yrs pale cream. Smart little bitch who stands 4 square on her lovely small fett, lovely dark eyes and expression just lacking nose pigment. In good condition moved well and well handled.

VETERAN BITCH over 10 yrs 7 (2)

A lovely class of oldies who showed their socks off

1. Tricklebank's CH CAROZZA MAGDELENA FOR NOCTE - 11 ½ yr black. Delightful small cobby bitch just blowing coat with a lovely head and expression and all her teeth. Very well constructed and showed well, moved risk and true.

2. Hart's CH LUDWYNS BLACK VELVET - 10 ½ yr black. A beautiful bitch in excellent coat and condition, good head with dark eyes and correct bite. Very well constructed and moved well, just preferred the brighter expression of winner.

3. Forknall's CH AVIDORE FANCY PANTS - 10 yrs black. Another lovely cobby bitch in good condition, bright and alert, just beginning to show age.

Junior Section



My name is Leah Scales and I am 11 years old. I live with my mum and our 4 Schipperkes, Sid, Zest, Stanley and Squash.

I have always lived with dogs and started handling one of our Belgian Shepherds in agility competitions with my mum helping me when I was just 5 years old. I remember taking Paige into a child handling class at a local fete when I was 5 years old and winning it, I had the biggest smile on my face. I continued running agility classes with our Belgian Shepherds and as I got older I took them in on my own.

Sid came into our lives and mum started agility training with him (but he is a bit lazy!) and I tried to run him but he is very hard work. Mum wanted to breed Sid and keep a puppy from him as he has such a great temperament and eventually we got Zest. She is a real wiggly girl and while we were waiting for her to grow up mum started some ringcraft training with her and entered her into a few shows and she won some classes. As Zest was going to shows, mum decided to enter Sid in some as well as it was extra practice for her.

While we were at some of the shows I started watching the junior handling classes and thought I would like to have a go. I remember one of my early shows I was asked by the judge to show the teeth and I didn't know how to do it as I had never been shown. Mum used to have to lift Sid up onto and off the table as I wasn't tall enough but I can manage on my own now.

Mum bought me Marina Scott's book and DVD which is all about handling, it tells you how to hold the lead correctly and what all the different turns are. Mum and I have also been on a couple of handling courses which have helped. I mainly handle Sid in classes and then have also started to take him into breed classes as well.

Sid and I have qualified for the JHA semi finals held at Richmond championship show for the last 3 years and I have also qualified for this year. Last year I came 3rd in the 6-11 year old utility group. It has taken me quite a long time to train Sid to stand still while I walk around him, this is called shadowing, it is very important to make sure that you do not block the judges view of the dog, this is known as the golden rule. There are a lot of things to remember when taking part in handling classes, how to hold the lead correctly, how to show the teeth and bite of the dog, listening carefully when the judge tells you which patterns they want to see, you also need to know the points of the dog as sometimes the judge will ask you where certain parts of the dog are. It is very important to dress smartly when you take part in the handling classes and I now have some lovely suits, mum makes sure that she gets colours that show Sid off.

I have made lots of friends and enjoy helping some of the younger competitors in the same way that some of the older girls helped me when I had just started.

I am a member of the YKC and have a little book to collect points for showing and handling classes, when you have 150 points for either showing or handling classes you can send your book in and you will be sent a badge.

As I've become more and more confident I have started to handle other dogs and other breeds as well.

The most important thing is to remember that you always leave the ring with the best dog.

I have been handling schipperkes for 8 years and during that time I have personally won 2 championship certificates and 7 reserve championship certificates. I have also qualified for YKC handling finals at Crufts, JHA handling semi-finals, Scottish handling finals and Scottish Top Dog with CH Carozza Athena and Aradet Zulu von Zorbaloo. I won my first RCC at the age of nine under Sheila Jakeman, and my first CC under Marion Seargent aged 11.

I have shown in the group ring several times and what an experience that is standing with all the top handlers. I get very nervous standing beside some of the big names in the dog world, but they have all been really nice to me.

I was brought up with Akitas, however my parents decided that the Schipperke would be a nice dog for me to handle, little did they know. Since being involved with Schipperkes I have learned that they have a mind of their own, if they don't want to show they won't. It takes lots of love and dedication and work to understand this special breed.

At home my Schipperkes are great loving family dogs that can be very boisterous, but what fun they are, doing all sorts of strange things, when you least expect it. When you look at them in the ring I feel people think it's a very easy dog to show, if only they knew. I enjoy the challenge that they give you as a breed, but you have to remember that schipperkes can have an off day, they might not like the judge or the venue and simply not like the bait you are using, preferring the person standing behind you in the ring or even in the next ring.

The main thing to remember when showing Schipperkes is that you take the best dog home even when you have had a bad day. Michaella Donaldson

Junior dog (1)

1 Butter's Roopec Admire Me

Such a handsome boy and so aptly named. Well balanced cobby gold dog of correct proportion. Lovely shading and coat demarcation with correct harsh texture. Dark oval eyes with excellent black pigment and black nose. Good tail set. Just needs to be a little naughty and not so obedient to show-off his lively and alert character and move more freely. RBD

Open Dog (2)

1 Morley's Ch,Am Ch Chatelet Aradet Rugby (Imp) Sh CM

Beautifully shaped and balanced handsome black dog of the correct size, lovely head with flat skull and correct oval eye, good balance of muzzle with neat well set erect ears. Good lay of shoulder, good spring of brisket with correct depth. Shown in good muscular condition with good brisk movement. Dense coat in excellent condition. BD and BOB 2 Robjohn's Qwantox Quincy.

Larger in type than 1, but well balanced handsome black dog and in excellent condition who move-out out smartly with tail up and over on the move. Happy lively temperament. Good in proportion substance, correct coat texture and demarcation, lovely dark oval eye, neat feet. Preferred head and size of 1

Good Citizen Dog Scheme (1)

1 Robjohns Quintessential ShCM

Larger black 6 year old bitch shown in lovely condition. Well balanced and constructed with typical brisk movement. Good head of correct proportion with dark oval eye, correct coat texture, lovely bright and alert expression. RBB

Puppy bitch (1)

1 Forknall's Schojan Reve D'Or at Avidore

Very feminine cream girl with delightful lively and alert character. Balanced head with erect ears and in proportion, excellent black pigmentation, neat oval eyes, tight cat-like feet, good harsh coat. Moved-out well tail carried up and over.

Post Graduate Bitch

1 Fegan's Wagaman Black Magic

Delightful black bitch of the more tradition type. Pretty well-balanced head, dark eye of correct shape with ears in proportion, good harsh texture to coat, neat feet, well set tight-curled tail .Well constructed with good length of leg. Very sound in movement and with typical lively and alert character.

Limit Bitch (3)

1 Feegan's Carozza Justa Madam at Wagaman

BROCCOLI & BACON SOUP WITH STILTON

Serves 6

1tbsp olive oil 7 rashers back bacon, chopped 1 onion, chopped 2 garlic cloves, crushed 1.2kg/2lb 10oz broccoli, chopped 3 chicken stock cubes, crumbled 500g/1lb 2oz frozen peas 75ml/3fl oz double cream Salt & freshly ground black pepper 185g/6¹/₂oz Stilton cheese Freshly snipped chives, to garnish, optional

1 Heat half the oil in a large heavy-based pan over a medium heat. Fry the bacon, stirring, for 4 minutes or until browned! Remove with a slotted spoon, drain on kitchen paper & set aside.

2 Add the onion to the pan & cook, stirring for 3 minutes, adding the garlic for the final 1 minute. Add the broccoli, crumbled stock cubes & 2ltr/3½pt of boiling water. Bring to the boil, then reduce the heat & simmer for 10 minutes. Add the peas & cook for 4 minutes or until the vegetables are tender. 3 Remove from the heat & leave to cool slightly. Blend with a hand blender or an electric one until smooth. Return the pan to a low heat, stir in the cream & half the cooked bacon. Cook for 3 minutes or until piping hot. Season with salt and pepper.

4 Ladle the soup into 6 bowls & top with the crumbled Stilton & remaining bacon. Garnish with chives & serve with warm crusty bread.



The Schipperke & the BEES

I can't quite recall exactly when it was but, it was early 2013 when I was asked if I had a dog that could be Toto in November. William was the obvious choice, but he would only be 11 months old by the time of the performances – could he be ready to take on such a challenge by then? At that point, I had no doubt he would be ready. Never had I had such a smart and devoted dog. Training was (and still is) a delight, so eager to please and be doing with his Mum. No sign of the arrogance, independence, & outright defiance that the young Eski had given me. To be fair seven and half years of more knowledge & experience & experience has made me a better trainer and there is still room for improvement.

But, there is no doubt that William is special. An excellent puppyhood with Bev & Leah Manners has giving him the skills to cope with all he encounters. So no matter that the BEES in question are the Burnham Excellent Entertainment Society, comprising of a sprinkling of adults and a majority of children. They started their rehearsals for The Wizard of Oz way back in July and we managed to join them for the first time mid-October, once the Obedience season had abated. This first visit always brings chaos to rehearsals as the children are very distracted by the dog, as are some of the adults! Vicky, the director, suggested that it might be simpler to just train William to do the running on to stage scenes and use a stuffed dog in a basket for the rest of the production as Toto was required to be on stage for most of the production and it might just be too much to ask of a young dog. Knowing how much energy & attention William has, I suggested that they tried him as the script meant for Toto to be on a lead and I felt sure that he would dutifully pay attention to any cast member if they



routinely treated him. Dorothy was being played by the very talented Melissa, who had played Annie two years previously and coped with the far more formidable Pyrenean Sheep Dog, in comparison William is a piece of putty.

Rehearsals went well and we didn't have a blip until the dress & technical rehearsal. Dorothy is calling for Toto at the beginning of the first scene, William enters from the auditorium misses the steps he's been trained to go up and heads straight for the front of the stage, makes a fairly good effort at jumping on stage but misses and almost gets tangled in the live orchestra, I manage to catch him and re-route him up the steps only to bang my head on the safety rail! Of course, I mused as I rubbed my head to check for blood, we hadn't practiced with the blacked out theatre and spotlights before. So the wee boy had taken the most direct and lit route. That was a painful learning curve for me. Needless to say, I made sure we worked on those entrances with stage and auditorium lighting prior to the performances.

On the Saturday night of the first performance, the production team announce that there is a smoke machine, another thing that we haven't practiced, but I reason that William will not be phased by that. He wasn't! However, what they fail to tell me is that the Professor will have some real sausages to cook on stage and that Toto is meant to steal one. Whoever is meant to have cooked and brought the sausages has forgotten so someone is dispatched to the local fish & chip shop. So the most memorable scene my friends talk about is Toto playing with an enormous sausage, which he just obviously doesn't know what to do with. I of course would have suggested they used a chippolata !!!
